Maritime Health Notice, No. 299.

IN view of official information received, and the opinion of the Consultative Board of Public Health having been heard, it is hereby declared that arrivals from all ports of Spain on the Atlantic will (henceforth) be subjected to three days' quarantine of observation in the ports of the continental Kingdom and the adjacent islands, except arrivals from the southern ports (of Spain) and from the port of Santander, arrivals from which latter ports therefore still remain subject to the treatment heretofore in force.
