THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Notice issued by the Italian Government, of which the following is a Translation, viz. :—

Ordinance of Maritime Health, No. 3.

The Minister of the Interior,

Having officially ascertained that the sanitary conditions of Algeria are satisfactory, decrees:

Quarantine is this day abolished for ships arriving from Algeria, and they will be admitted to pratique even though they are now under observation, after medical inspection, provided that they have clean bills of health and a clean passage. (Signed) MORANA.
