Any Lady who proposes to be presented must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, before twelve o'clock, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her inten-tion to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's appro-bation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Rooms, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. A PROCLAMATION.

In order to the Electing two Peers of Scotland.

VICTORIA, R.

HEREAS the Right Honourable William Henry, Viscount Strathallan, and the Right Honourable Alexander, Lord Saltoun, were duly elected and returned to be two of the Sixteen Peers of Scotland to sit in the House of Peers in the present Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and are since deceased: In order to the Electing two other Peers of Scotland to sit in their room, We do, by the advice of Our Privy Council, issue forth this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to assemble and meet at Holyrood House, at Edinburgh, on Thursday, the twenty-fifth day of March instant, between the hours of twelve and two in the afternoon, to nominate and choose two other Peers of Scotland to sit and vote in the House of Peers in this present Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, in the room of the said William Henry, Viscount Strathallan, and Alexander, Lord Saltoun, deceased, by open election and plurality of voices of the Peers that shall be then present, and of the proxies of such as shall be absent (such proxies being Peers and producing a mandate in writing duly signed before witnesses, and both the constituent and proxy being qualified according to law): and the Lord Clerk Register, or such two of the Principal Clerks of the Session as shall be appointed by him to officiate in his name, are hereby respectively required to attend such meeting, and to administer the oaths required by law to be taken there by the said Peers, and to take their votes; and immediately after such election made and duly examined, to certify the names of the Peers so elected, and to sign and attest the same in the presence of the said Peers the electors, and return such certificate into Our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain: and We strictly charge and command that this Our Royal Proclamation be duly published at the Market Cross at Edinburgh, and in all the county towns of Scotland, ten days at least before the time hereby appointed for the meeting of the said Peers to proceed on such election.

Given at Our Court at Windsor, this eighth day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and in the forty-ninth year of Our reign.

Further know ye, that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your ability and discretion, have appointed, and do by these presents nominate, constitute, and appoint you, the said George John Shaw Lefevre, Joseph Chamberlain, Sir Astley Cooper Key, Edward Heneage, Sir Charles Parker Butt, Sir John Eldon Gorst, John Aste, Thomas Charles Baring, Thomas Burt, Henry Green, James Kennedy, George Alexander Laws, James McGregor, Henry Watson Parker, William Pearce, Thomas Bland Royden, Lawrence Douglas Smith, Leonard Charles Wakefield, William Walton, and John Warrack, to be Our Commissioners to inquire into the extent and cause of the Loss of Ships and Lives at Sea since the Report of Our Commission on Unscaworthy Ships, and for any of the purposes set forth in the original Warrant under Our Sign Manual, dated the first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

And for the purpose of carrying out the said enquiry, We do hereby authorize and empower you, or any five or more of you, to call before you, or any five or more of you, all such persons as you shall judge most competent by reason of their situation, knowledge, or experience to afford you correct information on the matters submitted for your consideration, and every matter connected therewith, and also to call for, have acces to, and examine, all such books, documents, registers, and records as you shall judge likely to afford you the fullest information on the subject of this Our Commission, and to enquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means

whateoever.

And We do further by these presents authorize and empower you, or any five or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places in Our United Kingdom as you may deem expedient for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes of this Our Commission, and to employ such persons as you may think fit to assist you in conducting any enquiry which you may hold:

And We do by these presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our Commissioners, or any five or more of you, may, from time to time, proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by

adjournment.

And Our further will and pleasure is that you, or any five or more of you, may have liberty to report to Us your proceedings under this Our Commission, from time to time, if you shall judge

it expedient so to do.

And We further ordain, that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us, under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any five or more of you, your opinion upon the matters submitted for your consideration.

And for your assistance in the execution of

The rates of postage and additional sum for registration now chargeable and payable by the authority of the Treasury Warrant of the 29th day of May, 1879, or the schedules thereunder written, on postal packets conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post from or to Salvador, to or from any other country or place affected by the provisions of such last-mentioned Warrant of the 29th day of May, 1879, and all regulations and conditions as to the posting, forwarding, conveyance, and delivery of postal packets conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post now in force and applicable thereto, shall extend and apply to all postal packets conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post from or to the Republic of Bolivia, to or from any other country or place affected by the provisions of such last-metioned Warrant of the 29th day of May, 1879, in the same way as if the Republic of Bolivia, had been named in such lastmentioned Warrant of the 29th day on May, 1879, or the schedules thereunder written.

3. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Altering Consolidated Order. Outdoor Labour Test:—

Cookham Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Cookham
Union, in the county of Berks;—

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the several parishes comprised in the said Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WE, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order, with respect to the relief of the Poor in the said Cookham Union, as follows:—

ARTICLE 1.—Subject to the provisions of the General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners, dated the twenty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in force in the Union, every able-bodied male pauper who receives relief within the Union, and is relieved out of the Workhouse, shall be relieved in the following manner; that is to say:—

following manner; that is to say:—
Half at least of the relief given to such pauper shall be given in food, clothing, and other articles

of necessity.

No such pauper shall receive relief from the Guardians, or any of their officers, or any Overseer of any Parish in the Union, while he is employed for wages or other hire or remuneration by any person; but every such pauper so relieved shall be set to work by the Guardians.

ARTICLE 2.—The Guardians shall, within fourteen days after the day when this Order comes into force, and from time to time afterwards as the Local Government Board may require, report to the Local Government Board the place or places at which able-bodied male paupers shall be so set to work in the Union, the sort or sorts of work in which they or any of them shall be employed, the times and mode of work, and all such other matters relating to the employment of such able-bodied paupers as the said Guardians shall deem material to be communicated to the Local Government Board, or as the Local Government Board shall require.

ARTICLE 3.—If the Guardians shall depart, in any particular instance, from any of the regulations hereinbefore contained, and shall, within fifteen days after such departure, report the same and the grounds thereof to the Local Government Board, and if the Local Government Board shall approve of such departure, then the relief granted in such particular instance shall, if otherwise lawful, not be deemed to be unlawful, or be subject to be disallowed.

And whereas provision is made in a General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in force in the said Union, for the appointment of an officer, to be termed a Superintendent of Outdoor Labour, and for the continuance in office of such officer, and it is expedient that further provision should be made as hereinafter mentioned;

We therefore further Order, that if at any time the number of able-bodied male paupers requiring relief shall be so small as to render the services of a Superintendent of Out-door Labour unnecessary, the Guardians may dispense with the services of such an officer.
