Whereas We did, by Warrant under Our Royal Sign Manual, bearing date the first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, and by a subsequent Warrant, bearing date the twentieth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, authorize and appoint Our right trusty and right well-beloved cousin and Councillor John Campbell, Earl of Aberdeen, together with the several gentlemen therein respectively named, or any five or more of them, to be Our Commissioners to inquire into the extent and cause of the Loss of Ships and Lives at Sea since the report of Our Commission on Unseaworthy Ships, and to report on the remedies for such losses, having special but not exclusive regard to the following subjects, viz.:—

The Laws concerning Marine Insurance, and the liability of Shipowners; the functions and
