(SWINE-FEVER.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 26th day of March, 1886.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after this twenty-sixth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

An Area comprising the borough of Beccles.

THE Queen has been pleased to give and grant unto Martin Edward Haworth, of York-street, Portman-square, in the county of Middlesex, Esquire, sometime a Captain in the 60th Royal Rifles, and late one of Her Majesty's Foreign Service Messengers, and to Mary Elizabeth, his wife, in her own right Countess of Rothes and Baroness Leslie and Ballinbreich, in that part of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland called Scotland, Her Royal licence and authority that they may take and henceforth use the surname of Leslie, in addition to and after that of Haworth, that he, the said Martin Edward Haworth may bear the arms of Leslie, and that such surname and arms may in like manner be taken, borne, and used by the

issue of their marriage; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect :

And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's said College of Arms.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Paris, enclosing copies of a Circular recently addressed by the Minister of Commerce and Industry to the French Chambers of Commerce, stating that it has been decided by the French Government that all goods coming from abroad, and bearing either the trade mark or the name of a French manufacturer, or the name of any French town or locality which would lead to a supposition that such goods were of French manufacture, shall be seized by the Customs' authorities at the port of entry in conformity with Article 19 of the Law of 23rd of June, 1857.
