THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Copenhagen, enclosing the following translation of a Notice respecting quarantine issued by the Danish Government:—

The Proclamation of the Ministry of Justice, dated the 6th instant, respecting the revoking of the Proclamations of the 11th of November, 1885, and of the 3rd of February, 1886, is altered, in so far that French ports between Cherbourg and the Belgian frontier are excluded from the list of places with reference to which the provisions contained in Part 2, section I, of the Act of the 2nd of July, 1880, for preventing the introduction of contagious diseases into Denmark, are in force.

This Proclamation shall at once take effect.
