PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Right Honourable Hugh Culling Eardley Childers, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbents and the Churchwardens of the parishes hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has, under the provisions of an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England beyond the limits of the Metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning the burial of the dead in the Metropolis," made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground should be opened in the undermentioned parishes without the previous consent of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discontinued therein with the following modifications, viz. :—

GREAT SAMPFORD.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Great Sampford, in the county of Essex; and also in the Churchyard, after the thirty-first December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, except as follows :—

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In such partly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard, provided that the earth above them can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order as can be buried at or below that depth.

(c.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard, as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order as can be buried at or below that depth.

DARTINGTON.—Forthwith and entirely in the old Parish Churchyard of Dartington, in the county of Devon, except as follows :—

(a.) In such wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In such partly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard, provided that the earth above them can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order, as can be buried at or below that depth.

(c.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard, as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order, viz. : widows, widowers, parents and unmarried children, as can be buried at or below that depth.

WOOTTON.—Forthwith and entirely in Wootton Church, in the county of Berks; and also in the Churchyard, after the thirty-first October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, except as follows :—

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard, as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order, viz., widows and widowers, as can be buried at or below that depth.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the seventeenth day of May next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette; and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of,

or on some conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before the said seventeenth day of May.

And whereas Orders in Council have been made directing the discontinuance of burials in the churchyards hereinafter mentioned from the time specified in such Orders; and whereas it seems fit to Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that the time for discontinuing burials in the said churchyards be postponed:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the time for the discontinuance of burials in such churchyards be postponed as follows, viz. :—

In the Parish Churchyard of *Stretham*, in the county of *Cambridge*, to the thirtieth day of *September*, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

In the Parish Churchyard of *Acton*, in the county of *Chester*, to the thirtieth day of *June*, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 7th day of April, 1886.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the eighth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

An Area round Crastock Farm, in the parish of Woking, in the county of Surrey, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing at a point in Berry-lane where a foot-path to the main Guildford and Knaphill-road leaves the lane, thence by such foot-path to its junction with such main-road, thence by an imaginary line to Sanders-lane, thence by Sanders-lane to its junction with Berry-lane aforesaid, thence across Berry-lane and by the foot-path to Ellis Place Farm, thence by the south boundary fences of the fields numbered 1214 and 1213 on the 25-inch ordnance map to Berry-lane aforesaid, and thence by such lane in an easterly direction till the foot-path leading to the main Guildford and Knaphill-road is again reached.

Newcastle-upon-Tyne Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Newcastle-upon-Tyne Union, in the County of the Town of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, and County of Northumberland :—

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes, and to the Overseers of the Poor of the several Townships, comprised in the said Union ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by an Order dated the 3rd day of May, 1869, the Poor Law Board ordered that the Guardians of the Poor of the said Newcastle-upon-Tyne Union might form one or two Committees out of their body, and might from time to time assign to such Committee the whole or part of the District of any of the Relieving Officers of the said Union, in order that each such Committee might hear and determine all applications for relief on account of poor persons residing or being in the District or part of the District of any of the Relieving Officers of the Union which might have been assigned to such Committee ; and that each such Committee might give all directions respecting the continuance of relief to poor persons residing or being in such District or part of such District, in such manner as the said Guardians, acting as a Board, should be authorized to do ;

And whereas by a General Order dated the 5th day of September, 1877, addressed, among others, to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Newcastle-upon-Tyne Union, We, the Local Government Board, ordered that the said Guardians might authorize the said Relief Committee or Committees to deal with all applications for payment of school fees on account of parents,

not being paupers, residing or being in the District or part of the District which might have been so assigned to such Committee or Committees; and that such Committee or Committees should thereupon hear and determine all such applications, and give all directions respecting the continuance of the payment of the fees, in such manner as the Guardians, acting as a Board, might be authorized to do;
