WHEREAS by the provisions of the Patents, Designs, and Trade Marks Act, 1883, it is,

amongst other things, provided :---

That if Her Majesty is pleased to make any arrangement with the Government or Governments of any foreign state or states for mutual protection of inventions, designs, and trade marks, or any of them, then any person who has applied for protection for any invention, design, or trade mark in any such state shall, subject to the conditions further provided and set forth in the said Act, be entitled to a patent for his invention, or to registration of his design or trade mark (as the case may be) under the said Act in priority to other applicants, and such patent or registration shall have the same date as the date of the protection obtained in such foreign state:

And whereas it has pleased Her Majesty to make an arrangement of the nature contemplated by the said Act by and in virtue of a declaration signed and sealed by Her Majesty's Ambassador at Paris on the seventeenth March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, duly conveying the accession of Great Britain to the International Convention and Protocol for the Protection of Industrial Property signed by representatives of certain Powers on the twentieth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, and duly ratified on the sixth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, power being creserved to Her Majesty to hereafter accede to

the provisions of the said Convention and Protocol on behalf of the Isle of Man, the Channel Islands, and any of Her Majesty's Possessions, which Declaration of Accession was duly accepted by the French Government on behalf of the Signatory Powers by and in virtue of a Declaration data the second of April, one thousand eight

hundred and eighty-four:

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased by an Order in Council dated the twenty-sixth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, to declare that the provisions of the said Act. hereinbefore specified should apply to the several countries mentioned in the said Order; and it was further ordered and declared that such Order should take effect from the seventh day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four:

And whereas it has been intimated to Her Majesty's Government that the Government of the Republic of Ecuador, one of the said several countries so mentioned, has by a Note on their behalf, dated the twenty-sixth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, and addressed to the Government of the Swiss Confederation, given notice of the termination of adhesion to the said Convention; and whereas by Article eighteen of the said Convention it is provided that the provisions of the said Convention shall remain in force as regards any country so terminating its adhesion till the expiry of one year from the date of such notice:

Now therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of Her Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority committed to Her by the said Act, doth declare and it is hereby declared that the provisions of the said Act hereinbefore specified shall cease to apply to the said country,

viz. :--

Ecuador;

And it is further ordered and declared that this Order shall take effect from the twenty-sixth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

W HEREAS Charles Walker, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, duly appointed in pursuance of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as Commissioner for the purpose of determining the boundaries of the Wards of the borough of New Windsor, and of apportioning the Councillors thereto, transmitted to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State his determination and apportionment in the following terms:—

"MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT, 1882.
"45 and 46 Vict. cap. 50.

" BOROUGH OF NEW WINDSOR.

"Whereas Her Majesty has been pleased by and with the advice of Her Privy Council and in pursuance and exercise of the power vested in Her Majesty by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, to fix the number of Wards into which the borough of New Windsor in the county of Berks shall be divided and to order and direct that the number of the said wards shall be three, which Order was made on the sixth day of February one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

"And whereas on the twenty-third day of February one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six the Right Honourable Hugh Culling Eardley Childers one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State in pursuance of the thirtieth section of the said Act did duly appoint Charles Walker Esquire Barrister-at-Law to be a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme for determining the Councillers among them

the Councillors among them.

"Now I the said Charles Walker do hereby in exercise of the power given to me by virtue of the said appointment determine as hereinafter mentioned the boundaries of the three Wards into which the said borough is to be divided which Wards are hereinafter numbered and named as follows; that is to say:—

"Ward No. 1 otherwise the Castle Ward. "Ward No. 2 otherwise the Park Ward.

"Ward No. 3 otherwise the Clewer Ward

"And I do hereby determine that Ward No. 1 otherwise the Castle Ward shall comprise so much of the parish of New Windsor as lies to the north of a dividing line starting from the bank of the River Thames in the Home Park at the extreme eastern end of the private carriage drive called Queen Elizabeth's Walk about 630 yards eastward of the kennels and proceeding along the centre of the said Queen Elizabeth's Walk to the point where the said walk turns to the northward, and thence in a straight line across the Home Park and the Long Walk to the Brook-street stile, and thence along the centre of Brook-street across Sheet-street to the centre of Keppel-street at its junction with Frances-road, thence along the centre of Keppel-street and then turning to the right to the centre of Love-lane at its eastern end, thence along the centre of Lovelane across Alexandra-road to the north-eastern corner of the Grove House Estate, and thence along the northern boundary of the Grove House Estate to the boundary of the parish of Clewer in Spital-road.

"And I do hereby determine that Ward No. 2 otherwise the Park Ward shall comprise so much of the parish of New Windsor as lies to the south of such dividing line. And that Ward No. 3 otherwise the Clewer Ward shall comprise so much of the borough of New Windsor as lies

within the parish of Clewer being the remaining; portion of the said borough.

"And I do hereby apportion six Councillors to each of the said Wards and assign them as follows, that is to say:—

"To Ward No. 1, otherwise the Castle Ward,

"Thomas Dyson, "Thomas Large.

"George Rubie.

" William John McCloskie.

" William Sevenoakes.

"To Ward No. 2 otherwise the Park Ward, Councillors:

" George Cartland.

" John Oberlin-Harris.

"Joseph Lundy.

"Thomas Dolling Bolton.

"To Ward No. 3, otherwise the Clewer Ward, . Councillors:

"John Webb.

"George Henry Peters.

"Frederick Augustus Layton.

"Joseph Gane.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act of the sixth and seventh years of Hermajesty chapter thirty seven sections six and eight duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of an Act of the sixth and seventh of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven, sections six and eight have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property formerly belonging to the Sub-Chanter and Vicars Choral of the Cathedral. Church of Saint David's and now vested in us.

"Whereas under an Act of the twenty-seventh and twenty-eighth years of Your Majesty chapter seventy and by virtue of an Order of Your Majesty in Council made under the provisions of the same Act and bearing date the twenty-first day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six and duly published in the London Gazette on the twenty-fifth day of the same month certain lands and other hereditaments then belonging to the said sub-chanter and vicars choral became absolutely vested in us for

the purposes and subject to the provisions applicable to other hereditaments vested in us.

"And whereas a considerable part of the lands and hereditaments aforesaid are demised by beneficial leases for terms of years and produce during the subsistence of such leases only a small annual revenue, and on that account and in some instances on account of the character or situation of the property are unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed.

"And whereas by an Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and twenty-four power is given to lessees holding under us in the event of our declining to enter into a treaty for the sale of our reversions or the purchase of the leasehold interests to require us to purchase such leasehold interests

at a valuation.

"And whereas with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the said lands and hereditaments or of the proceeds thereof for the ultimate improvement of our common fund it is expedient that the said lands and hereditaments or such part or parts thereof as we shall at any time and from time to time think fit should be sold or disposed of and accordingly that we should be empowered to dispose of our interest therein or in any part or parts thereof in such manner as shall

appear to us advisable.

"Now therefore we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorized and empowered by instrument or instruments in writing duly executed according to law from time to time to sell or dispose of and duly to convey according to the provisions of the said Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty's reign with the consent of the respective holders (if any) to be testified by their being made parties to such instruments all or any of the said lands and heredita-ments heretofore belonging to the said sub-chanter and vicars-choral and so vested in us as aforesaid with their appurtenances and all our estate right title and interest therein or in any part or parts thereof unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same and his her or their heirs executors administrators or assigns or otherwise as he she or they shall direct or appoint and for such consideration as shall upon due calculation and inquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale from time to time as occasion may arise in the purchase of other lands tithes rent-charges, tenements or hereditaments or of some estate or interest therein convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid and in the meantime to invest the proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary stock or other public securities in England.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts

or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and Her belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that so long as the Reverend William Rylance Melville now the rector or incumbent of the rectory of the said parish of Matlock shall continue to be such received in respect of such publication solemnization or performance at the said church of All Saints shall be paid over by the minister thereof

Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of St. David's.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the first day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, in the

words following, that is to say:-

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursurance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of All Saints situate at Matlock Bank in the parish of Matlock in the county of Derby and in the diocese of Southwell.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of All Saints situate at Matlock Bank as aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend George Bishop of the said diocese of Southwell (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Matlock which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of All Saints, situate at Matlock Bank as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of All Saints Matlock Bank.

" And with the like consent of the said George Bishop of the said diocese of Southwell (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of All Saints situate at Matlock Bank as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that so long as the Reverend William Rylance Melville now the rector or incumbent of the rectory of the said parish of Matlock shall continue to be such rector or incumbent all the fees which may be received in respect of such publication solemnization or performance at the said church of All

to the said William Rylance Melville; and provided also, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of All Saints Matlock Bank, being:---

"All that part of the parish of Matlock in the county of Derby and in the diocese of Southwell, wherein the present incumbent of such parish still possesses the exclusive cure of souls, which is bounded upon the south-east by the new parish of Tansley, upon the north-east by the parish of Ashover upon the north-west by the parish of Darley, all in the county and diocese aforesaid, and upon the remaining side that is to say upon the south partly by the new parish of South Darley in the same county and diocese, and partly by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of South Darley from the parish of Matlock aforesaid at a point in the middle of the River Derwent distant six chains or thereabouts to the north-west of the centre of the bridge which carries the line of the Midland Railway over the same river, at which point the said boundary diverges from the said river in a southerly direction, and extending thence that is from the said point, south-eastward along the middle of the said river for a distance of fifty-four chains or thereabouts thereby passing under the railway bridge aforesaid, to the centre of Matlock Bridge which carries the high road from Snitterton to Chesterfield over the same river and extending thence that is from the lastlymentioned bridge first north-eastward, then eastward and then again north-eastward along the middle of the said high road for a distance of fortyeight chains or thereabouts to its junction on the northern side of Yew Tree House with the road and footpath which leads past the northern side of Chesterfield House and past the northern side of Hurst Farm House, into the lane which leads from the said farm house towards the Duke of Wellington Inn, and extending thence that is from the said high road along the middle of the said road and footpath for a distance of twenty chains or thereabouts to the boundary at the junction of the same road and footpath with the last-described lane, which boundary divides the said parish of Matlock from the new parish of Tansley aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Southwell.

THEREAS the Right Honourable Hugh Culling Eardley Childers, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the parish hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has, under the provisions of an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the "laws concerning the burial of the dead in "England beyond the limits of the Metropolis, "and to amend the Act concerning the burial " of the dead in the Metropolis," made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground should be opened in the undermentioned parish without the previous consent of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discontinued therein with the following modifications, viz.:-

CHECKLEY. - Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Checkley, in the county of Stafford; and also in the churchyard except as follows:--

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In such partly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard, provided that the earth above them can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order as can be buried at or below that depth.

(c.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard, as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order, viz.:—widows and widowers as can be buried at or below that depth.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the twenty-ninth day of May next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette; and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parish affected by such representation, one month before the said twenty-ninth day of May.

REGULATIONS as to Claims for Compensation under the Metropolitan Police (Compensation) Act, 1886, as approved by the Secretary of State, and ordered by him to be published in the London Gazette in terms of above Statute.

As to Claims.

ALL claims shall be made in writing and delivered to the Receiver for the Metropolitan Police District, at No. 4, Whitehall-place, S.W., before the 31st day of May, 1886, and shall be on the forms prepared for the purpose, and obtainable at No. 4, Whitehall-place.

The claim shall specify separately the sums claimed for (a) Injury done to premises (including therein windows, fittings, and fixtures), (b) Injury done to property, (c) Property stolen or destroyed; and shall state the premises which have been injured or wherein the property was injured, stolen, or destroyed, and distinguish property of the claimant from that in his care belonging to

In cases of injury to premises or property, the claim shall state shortly the nature of the injury, and where it has been repaired the cost of repairs, and the claimant shall send with the claim the bill for such repairs, and where the injury has not been made good he shall send a specification of the repairs required and an estimate by a com-

petent person of their cost.

Where property has been injured, stolen, or destroyed the claim shall, where practicable (except in the case of articles of the same nature and of small value, and where the cost of repairs only is claimed), specify each article separately, and the sum claimed for it or the injury thereto; and where practicable the claimant shall send with his claim vouchers or copies of vouchers for the sums paid by him for the property.

The claim shall state generally the evidence the claimant is prepared to offer in support of it, and where such documents as he proposes to put in evidence may be inspected, and whether the claimant has received or is entitled to or may receive any compensation from any (and if so what) source for any loss included in his claim

and the amount thereof.

The claim must be confined to injury done to houses or shops in the Metropolitan Police District, or in the City, occupied by the claimant, or if they were empty owned by him, and to property in such houses or shops occupied by the claimant injured, stolen, or destroyed by persons taking part in a riot on the 8th February last. No other claims can be entertained. No claim

can be entertained which is received after the said 31st May, 1886, or which is not in accordance with these regulations.

The claimant shall make such a statutory declaration as the receiver may require, and procure and furnish to the receiver such other statutory declaration as the receiver may require, verifying the claim, and he shall produce to the receiver and to any person nominated by him all documents under his control needed to support his claim, and deliver to the receiver copies thereof or extracts therefrom as he may require, and the claimant shall give access to the premises and produce the property for injury to which he makes a claim to the receiver and any person nominated by him.

As to Appeal.

If the claimant is dissatisfied with the receiver's decision in respect of his claim, he shall, within 10 days after its being notified to him, intimate to the receiver in writing his desire to appeal, and the receiver shall thereupon transmit such notice to the arbitrator.

Generally.

The receiver may make separate awards as regards property of the claimant and property not belonging to him. Where an award includes compensation for property in the care of but not belonging to the claimant, it may provide that prior to payment the claimant shall either produce receipts from the owners for the sums payable to them, or their authority to him to receive the same, or that the claimant or some other person, to be approved of by the receiver, shall enter into a bond with the receiver for such sum as the award shall name for securing payment to the owners of such property of the sums due to them; and where an award includes compensation for stolen property, it may provide for a similar bond for securing repayment to the receiver of the compensation paid for any stolen property which may be subsequently recovered.

No costs will be allowed to any claimant other than such costs of an appeal as may be allowed

by the arbitrator.

These regulations may from time to time be varied and further regulations may be made by the receiver, with the approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.
