

SUPREME COURT OF JUDICATURE.

HIGH COURT OF JUSTICE.

*Officers in Bankruptcy:*

THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, with the concurrence of the Lord Chancellor, do hereby, in the exercise of the powers for this purpose conferred upon them by the Courts of Justice Salaries and Funds Act, 1869, as extended by the Supreme Court of Judicature Act, 1881, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, determine and order as follows:—

1. As from the 1st day of January, 1886, the Clerks specified in the schedule hereto and all Clerks in future employed in the Bankruptcy Offices of the High Court shall be classified as First, Second, and Third Class Clerks respectively.

2. Subject and without prejudice to the position and status of the existing Clerks, there shall be employed in the Bankruptcy Offices of the High Court so many Clerks as may from time to time be necessary, not exceeding one First Class Clerk, seven Second Class Clerks, and eight Third Class Clerks.

3. There shall be paid to the Clerks specified in the said schedule the yearly salaries with the annual increments therein mentioned, and to all Clerks in future employed in the Bankruptcy Offices of the High Court the yearly salaries following, that is to say, to the First Class Clerk the sum of £500, rising by an annual increment of £20 to £600; to Second Class Clerks the sum of £250, rising by annual increments of £15 to £400; and to Third Class Clerks the sum of £100, rising by annual increments of £10 to £200.

4. Subject as aforesaid, the existing Clerks and all Clerks in future employed in the Bankruptcy Offices of the High Court shall be interchangeable, and liable to be transferred to and perform duties in any department of the Supreme Court of Judicature.

5. Unless under special circumstances the Lord Chancellor shall otherwise direct, a Second or Third Class Clerk shall not be promoted to a higher class until the acting head of the Department in which such Clerk shall for the time being be employed has certified in writing to the Lord Chancellor that such Clerk has discharged his duties in a satisfactory manner in every respect, and that he is fully qualified for promotion.
