Croydon Union.—Parish of Mitcham.

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Mitcham, in the County of Surrey;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS, on the application of the Churchwardens of the said parish of Mitcham, made in pursuance of a Resolution of the Vestry of that parish, the Poor Law Board, by an Order dated the 26th day of June, 1869, ordered that so much of the Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled "An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the Appointment of Vestry Clerks," as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk, should forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said parish;

And whereas at a Meeting of the Vestry of the said parish, held, pursuant to public notice in that behalf, in the Vestry of the Parish Church, on Friday, the 21st day of March, 1884, it was resolved,—

"That the Local Government Board be requested to issue an Order under their Seal of Office, directing that the Act passed on the 5th August, 1850 (13 and 14 Vict., c. 57), entitled 'An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the Appointment of Vestry Clerks,' shall be applied to and put in force within this Parish as regards the provision of accommodation for holding Vestry Meetings."

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said parish have made application in writing to the Local Government Board, pursuant to the above Resolution:

Now, therefore, we, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to us

by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—So much of the above-cited Act as relates to the providing of a room or suitable buildings for the purpose of holding Vestry or other Meetings shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said parish of Mitcham.

ARTICLE II.—A copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette by the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said parish.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the following Bye-laws and Regulations were made by the Local Board of Health for the parish of Tipton, in the county of Stafford, as the Local Authority under section 46 of "The Tramways Act, 1870," at a meeting, held on the 27th day of April, 1886:—

1. For the purpose of these Bye-laws and Regulations the term "car" shall mean any engine or carriage using any tramway laid down within the said parish, and the terms "driver" and "conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of an engine or car.

2. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all trams of any Company authorized by Provisional Order to work tramways in the parish of Tipton.

3. The driver of every car shall drive the same at a rate of not less than three miles an hour on the average, and not exceeding eight miles an hour along any tramway constructed in any part of the
