REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, before twelve o'clock, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case

the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

THE following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the existing Corporation of Wareham, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in pursuance of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by the School Boards Act, 1885.

"Whereas by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, it is enacted that where a petition for a charter of incorporation is referred to the Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and it is proposed by the charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the municipal borough to be created by the charter, the said Committee of Council may settle a scheme for the purposes in the said Act named, and containing such provisions as are in the said Act particularised:

"And whereas certain inhabitant householders of the Local Government District of Wareham, in the county of Dorset, have petitioned Her Majesty the Queen praying for the grant of a charter of incorporation."

charter of incorporation:

"And whereas the said petition for a charter has been referred to the Committee of Council, and it is proposed to create the said district a municipal borough and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof, and by the charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the municipal borough to be created by the charter:

"And whereas Wareham is a place named in the schedule to the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, and the area of the said place is not co-extensive with the area of the municipal borough proposed to be created by the said charter:

"And whereas by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, it is enacted that nothing in that Act shall prevent the application to any place of any charter applying the Municipal Corporations Acts which Her Majesty may be pleased to grant, or affect anything done in pursuance of those Acts

or any scheme thereunder, and shall not affect the | with all the franchises, rights, privileges, powers, operation of any such charter, thing, or scheme, save that nothing in the said Acts or scheme shall authorise the establishment or continuance of any court for the trial of civil actions, and that nothing in that Act shall affect the right to the benefit of any charity, or shall alter or confer any power of altering the defined charitable purposes (if any) to which any property was by

law applicable at the passing of that Act:
"And whereas by Order, dated the 23rd day of January, 1873, and made under the provisions of the Elementary Education Act, 1870, the Lords of the Committee of the Privy Council on Education (in this scheme referred to as "the Education Department"), formed a United School District by uniting the three adjoining school districts or parishes of Lady Saint Mary, Wareham, Saint Martin, Wareham, and the Holy Trinity, Wareham (such United School District being named the District of Wareham), and have caused a School Board to be formed for the said district.

"And whereas it is proposed by the said Charter to include in the proposed borough part only of each of the said three parishes respectively, and it is expedient to make such provisions with respect to the continuance of the present School Board for the District of Wareham, and such other provisions in relation to the said district, as are in this scheme contained.

"And whereas the Mayor, Capital Burgesses, and Assistants of the Borough of Wareham and t'e Local Board of the said District, and the School Board for the United District of Wareham, are Local Authorities within the meaning of Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882; as amended by the School Boards Act, 1885;

"And whereas the said Mayor, Capital Burgesses, and Assistants are a body corporate under and by virtue of certain Royal or other charters:

"And whereas it is expedient, right, and just that a scheme should be settled pursuant to Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by the School Boards Act, 1885, containing the provisions hereinafter contained.

"Now, therefore, the said Committee of Council have settled a scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby order and declare as follows :-

"1. This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as the Borough of Wareham Scheme, 1886.

"2. This Scheme shall come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the municipal borough created by the charter above referred to, or at the date of its confirmation by Parliament or Order in Council, whichever is This date is herein mentioned as 'the commencement of this Scheme.

. "3. The Mayor, Capital Burgesses, Assistants of the Borough of Wareham are herein referred to as the 'Old Corporation.' poration of the municipal borough created by the charter above mentioned is herein referred to as the 'New Corporation.' The Local Board of the said Local Government District of Warcham is herein referred to as the Local Board.

"4. The municipal borough created by the charter above referred to shall be and is hereby placed immediately on, from, and after the day of the first meeting of the Council of the municipal borough aforesaid within the jurisdiction of the Council of the said municipal borough as the Sanitary Authority.

"5. Immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme the Old Corporation shall be and the same is hereby abolished, and shall thenceforth be dissolved and cease to exist, together | same methods as they could have been recovered,

jurisdiction, authority, and exemptions of the said Old Corporation, and its members and officers as such of what kind soever they may be which have no pecuniary value.

"6. Immediately from and after the commencement of this scheme the Local Board shall be, and the same is hereby, abolished, and shall thenceforth be dissolved and cease to exist, together with all its jurisdiction, powers, and

authority whatsoever.

"7. All property of any kind whatsoever possessed by or vested in the Old Corporation, or any person or body in trust for it, or any of its members as such, or applicable for the benefit or under the direction of the Old Corporation or any of its members as such, which property is within the meaning of the second sub-section of section 4 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, applicable to charity or applicable to defined charitable purposes at the passing of that Act shall immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme vest in the following persons (to be designated the Trustees of Municipal Charities in the Borough of Wareham), viz., Stephen White Bennett, Freeland Filliter, Woodruffe Daniel, Thomas Randall, Thomas Lean Skewes, Frederick Marshallsay, and Cornelius jointly, to be by them applied in the manner in which and the purposes for which such property, or the income thereof, was before and at the passing of that Act applicable.

"8. All market property possessed by or vested in the Old Corporation and all liabilities attaching to the Old Corporation in respect of the same shall immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme vest in and attach to the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the said Municipal Borough, acting by the Council as the

Sanitary Authority.

"9. All property other than that in paragraphs 7 and 8 hereof referred to, possessed by, or vested in the Old Corporation, or any person or body in trust for it, or any of its members as such, or applicable for the benefit or under the direction of the Old Corporation, or any of its members as such, shall vest in the New Corporation, and (ave as is hereinafter expressly directed) shall by the New Corporation be held and applied exclusively for the municipal purposes of the municipal borough created as aforesaid, and the public benefit of the inhabitants of the said borough.

"10. All liabilities which immediately before the commencement of this Scheme attached to and were enforceable against the Old Corporation, or the property if ereof, shall attach to and be enforceable against the New Corporation so far only as the property vested in it under paragraph 9 may extend to satisfy such liabilities, and no further.

"11. Any investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy in respect of any debt, liability, penalty, or forfeiture due to or incurred by or on behalf of the Old Corporation before the commencement of this Scheme may be continued, prosecuted, or enforced by the New Corporation or against the New Corporation so far only as the property vested in it under paragraph 9 may extend to satisfy such liabilities, penalties, and forfeitures, and no further.

"12. All debts, arrears of rates, or other sums which immediately before the commencement of this Scheme were due or owing to or by the Local Board may be recovered, levied, and enforced by or against the New Corporation as nearly as may be in the same manner and by the Board.

13. So much of the area of the Local Government District of Wareham as is not included within the limits of the said Municipal Borough shall, for all the purposes of the Public Health Act, 1875, and any Act amending the same or incorporated therewith, be within and be part of the District of the Rural Sanitary Authority of the Wareham and Purbeck Union, and be within and subject to the jurisdiction of the said Sanitary Authority, and all the powers, rights, privileges, franchises, duties, and obligations of the said Sanitary Authority shall apply to and be exerciseable in the same as being part of the District of

the said Sanitary Authority.

"14. Notwithstanding the creation of the said municipal borough the District of Wareham shall be and continue a United School District, and the School Board for the District of Warcham shall continue to be the School Board for such District to the same extent and in the same manner in all respects as if at the time of the formation of the District of Wareham by the Education Department the said district had been formed by uniting the said borough and the respective parts of the parishes of Lady Saint Mary, Warcham, Saint Martin, Warcham, and the Hely Trinity, Warcham, not included in the said borough, and the raid School Board had been formed for a United School District formed as last aforesaid, and everything in connection with the said Board and District shall be done and had accordingly. Provided, however, that every act or omission done or made by the School Board of the District of Wareham, or in respect of the District of Wareham, before the commencement of this Scheme, shall be valid and effectual for all purposes if done or made in the same manner as if the said borough had been created coincidently with the commencement of this Scheme, and any bye-laws made by the School Board in force at the date of this Scheme shall continue in force.

"15. The term property in this Scheme means and includes all property, real and personal, and all things in action, and all rights of common or commonable rights, and rights to toll, and all franchises, privileges, and rights which have any pecuniary value, and all charters, records, deeds, books, and documents, and all rights and all claims to relief, and all rights to avoid contracts or otherwise, and includes any estate or interest, legal or equitable, in or in respect of any property so

defined.

"16. The term market property in this Scheme means and includes rights to market tells and all franchises, privileges, and rights of holding or otherwise relating to markets and all lands and premises used for the purpose of markets and rights of action and claims in respect of the aforesaid.

1. This Order may be cited as The Schleswig-

Holstein Order of 1886.

2. This Order extends to England and Wales and Scotland only.

3. In this Order terms have the same meaning as in The Foreign Animals Order of 1885.

4. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eightysix; and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, without prejudice to the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed on or before that day.

5. Cattle brought from a port or place in either of the parts of the German Empire respectively known as Schleswig and as Holstein, (in this Order referred to as Schleswig-Holstein cattle,) and sheep and goats brought from Schleswig or Holstein in the same vessel with Schleswig-Holstein cattle, may be landed for slaughter in a Foreign Animals

Wharf, but not elsewhere.

6. The landing of Schleswig-Holstein cattle in a Foreign Animals Wharf shall be subject to the condition that they are accompanied by a Declaration and Certificates, such as are indicated in the forms in the Schedule to this Order, or to the like

7. If the Declaration accompanying any cattle imported under this Order is untrue in any purticular, as regards any one of the cattle to which it relates, the master of the vessel shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1873 with respect to all the cattle to which the Declaration relates, unless he shows to the satisfaction of the Justices before whom he is charged, that he did not know of the same being so untrue, and that he could not with reasonable diligence have obtained that knowledge. THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Decree issued by the Governor-General of Algeria which provides, in respect of arrivals from Continental Italy, that admission shall be refused for all articles accounted susceptible by the General Regulations dated 22nd February, 1876, regarding Maritime Sanitary Police, and ranked in the 1st class according to Article 53, especially beds and bedding brought by passengers.

Amongst articles reckoned as susceptible are woollen and other stuffs in personal use.

Her Majesty's Ambassador at Rome, the following Translation of an Ordinance issued by the Government of Italy:—

1886.—Ordinance of Maritime Health No. 9.
THE Minister of the Interior, seeing that cases of cholera continue to occur in certain communes on the Adriatic coast of Italy, decrees:—

ART. I. The quarantine regulations actually in force in Sicily, Sardinia, and the adjacent Islands for arrivals from the Adriatic, are extended to ships leaving any other parts of the Kingdom for the said destinations, under the rules laid down in Ordinance No. 7 of April 18th last.

ART. 2. Ships on board of which illnesses of the nature of cholera, even when merely suspected, have occurred, will undergo a rigorous quarantine of 21 days at the lazzaretto of the Asinara.

ART. 3. The parcels post to Sicily and Sardinia is suspended from this day, excepting for parcels containing disinfectants, medicines, and surgical instruments. The importation into the said islands of rags, unwashed old clothes for sale, and manures, is prohibited from all parts of the kingdom.

ART. 4. Until further orders ships coming under these regulations may land and embark in quarantine in the ports of Sicily and Sardinia the mail-bags, passengers, and merchandise destined

for the continent.

ART. 5. For ships coming from Bari to any other point of the Adriatic Coast the disinfections prescribed by Ordinance No. 8 must be made for a period of 24 hours, unless the medical officer who visits the ship considers it indispensable to prolong them, in which case the Sanitary Authorities must invoke the authorization of the Prefect of the Province.
