

and in a direct line for a distance of twenty-three and a half chains or thereabouts to the point at the north-western corner of the grounds attached to Belle Vue House where the boundary which divides the said chapelry of Saint James Southbroom from the parish of Rowde aforesaid diverges in a north-easterly direction from Iron Pear Tree-lane.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said parish of Rowde which is bounded upon the south-west by the new parish of Saint Peter Devizes aforesaid upon the east by the hereinbefore described portion of the said chapelry of Saint James Southbroom and upon the remaining side that is to say upon the north by an imaginary line commencing at the hereinbefore described point at the north-western angle of the grounds attached to Belle Vue House as aforesaid upon the boundary which divides the said chapelry of Saint James Southbroom from the parish of Rowde aforesaid and extending thence north-westward and in a direct line for a distance of thirty-three chains or thereabouts to the boundary at the northern angle of the house called or known as Oxhouse and situate upon the south-western side of the Devizes and Chippenham-road which boundary divides the said parish of Rowde from the new parish of Saint Peter Devizes aforesaid."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Salisbury.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme or representation bearing date the twentieth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty chapter

ninety-four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint Philip Litherland in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Liverpool.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-ninth day of June in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one and published in the London Gazette upon the fourth day of July following a part of the parish of Sefton in the county of Lancaster aforesaid and at that date in the diocese of Chester was assigned as a separate district to the consecrated church of Saint Philip situate at Litherland in such parish and the same was called 'The District Chapelry of Saint Philip Litherland.'

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the seventeenth day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy and published in the London Gazette on the nineteenth day of the same month a part of the said parish of Sefton was constituted a separate district or new parish for ecclesiastical purposes and the same was called 'The New Parish of Saint Thomas, Seaforth.'

"And whereas the district chapelry of Saint Philip Litherland aforesaid has under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and four become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act and by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Philip Litherland should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles John Bishop of the said diocese of Liverpool (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Philip Litherland shall be altered so that they shall include all that portion of the said new parish of Saint Thomas Seaforth and also all that portion of the parish of Walton-on-the-Hill which are described in the schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto appended and are thereon coloured pink and yellow respectively and that from and after the day of the same date and without any assurance in law other than such duly gazetted Order the said portion of the said new parish of Saint Thomas Seaforth and the said portion of the parish of Walton-on-the-Hill aforesaid shall be dis severed from such new parish and parish respectively and shall be included in and shall together become and be and form part of the said new parish of Saint Philip Litherland.

"And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.
