An Area in the Western Division of the county of Sussex, comprised within the following boundary, that is to say, commencing at the Bridge crossing the Railway near Rogate Station, along the road leading to South Harting (exclusive of the same road) to North-end Cottage, thence by the road to the Greyhound Public-house, round by Forberry Hill and Little Forberry Hill (inclusive of the last-mentioned road) into the Harting and Petersfield-road, along the same road past Hurst Farm to the boundary of the county of Sussex with the county of Southampton (exclusive of the last-mentioned road), along the said boundary northwards to the Midhurst and Petersfield Railway, and thence along the said Railway to the Bridge aforesaid.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely), — in the borough of Eastbourne, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the

junction of Avenue-road with Cavendish-place within the said borough, along Cavendish-place in a northerly direction to the London, Brighton, and South Coast Railway, thence along the south side of the said Railway to St. Leonards-road, continuing along St. Leonards-road to Seaside-road, thence by Beamsley-road to the sea-shore, and thence continuing in a westerly direction along the sea-shore to Avenue-road aforesaid,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the twenty-fifth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the ninth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.
