WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant and convey to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Llanfair-ar-y-bryn, in the county of Carmarthen, and in the diocese of Saint David's, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, all that piece or parcel of land and hereditaments, with the appurtenances thereunto belonging, particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed, and now vested in us (subject to certain covenants and stipulations respecting a water tank, drains, and pipes) under and by virtue of a certain deed of conveyance, dated the eighth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and made between David Edward Gwynne Vaughan, of Pantyrhedyn, in the parish of Llanfair-ar-y-bryn aforesaid, Esquire, of the first part, the Reverend Thomas Thomas, of Bank House, Llandovery, in the said county of Carmarthen, Clerk in Holy Orders, of the second part, Thomas Evans Williams, of

Crossway House, in the parish of Peterchurch, in the county of Hereford, Gentleman, of the third part, and us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, of the fourth part, which said deed of conveyance is intended to be deposited in the Registry of the said diocese of Saint David's, together with this instrument, after the publication of the latter in the London Gazette: To have and to hold the said piece or parcel of land and hereditaments, with their appurtenances (subject as aforesaid) to the use of the said Incumbent and his successors for ever: Provided always, that the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage of Llanfair-ar-y-bryn, shall be entitled to receive from us, or on our account, the net amount of the rents, profits, and proceeds of the said piece or parcel of land and hereditaments for and in respect of the period intervening between the said eighth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and the date of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette.
