THE SHETLAND (SARCOPTIC MANGE)
ORDER OF 1886.

A T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 22nd day of July, 1886.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

PRESENT:

Lord President. Sir Ughtred Kay-Shuttleworth.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Short Title.

1. This Order may be cited as The Shetland (Sarcoptic Mange) Order of 1886.

Extent.

2. This Order extends to the county of Shetland only.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eightysix.

Interpretation.

4. In this Order-

The Act of 1878 means The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878:

Fodder means hay or other substance commonly used for food of horses, asses, or mules:

Litter means straw or other substance commonly used for bedding or otherwise for or about horses, asses, or mules:

Master includes a person having the charge or command of a vessel:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1878.

Extension of Act of 1878:

5. Sarcoptic Mange of horses, asses, and mules (in this Order called Sarcoptic Mange) shall be a disease for the purposes of the following Sections of the Act of 1878 (namely):

Section thirty-one (notice of disease). Section thirty-two (Orders of Council). Section fifty (powers of police). Section fifty-one (powers of inspectors). and of all other Sections of the Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those Sections, including such Sections as provide for offences and procedure.

Duty of Police on Notice of Disease.

6. The constable to whom notice of the fact of a horse, ass, or mule being affected with sarcoptic mange, or with disease supposed to be sarcoptic mange, is given, under Section thirty-one of the Act of 1878, as extended by the last preceding Article, shall forthwith give information thereof to an Inspector of the Local Authority, who shall forthwith report the same to the Local Authority.

Optional Notice of Disease or Illness.

7. Any person having in his possession or under his charge a horse, ass, or mule affected with sarcoptic mange, or with any illness, or suspected of being so affected, besides giving such notice to a constable as he is required by Section thirty-one of the Act of 1878, as extended by Article five of this Order, to give, may, if he thinks fit, give notice of the fact of the horse, ass, or mule being so affected, or suspected, to the Inspector of the Local Authority.

Duty of Inspector to act immediately.

8. An Inspector of the Local Authority on receiving in any manner whatsoever information of the supposed existence of sarcoptic mange, or having reasonable ground to suspect the existence of sarcoptic mange, shall proceed with all practicable speed to the place where such sarcoptic mange, according to the information received by him, exists, or is suspected to exist, and shall there and elsewhere put in force and discharge the powers and duties by or under the Act of 1878, and any Order of Council, conferred and imposed on him as Inspector.

Public Warning as to Existence of Disease.

9.—(1.) The Local Authority may, if they think fit, from time to time, give public warning by placards, advertisement, or otherwise, of the existence of sarcoptic mange in any stable, building, field, or other place, with or without any particular description thereof, as they think fit, and may continue to do so during the existence of the disease, and in case of a stable, building, or other like place, until the same has been cleansed and disinfected.

(2.) It shall not be lawful for any person (without authority or excuse) to remove or deface any such placard.

Regulations of Local Authority as to Movement.

10. The Local Authority may, from time to time, make Regulations for the following purposes, or any of them:

(a.) For prohibiting or regulating the movement by land or by water of horses, asses, or mules in the whole of their District or in such part or parts thereof as may be specified by the Local Authority:

(b.) For prohibiting or regulating the movement by land or by water of horses, asses, or mules out of the whole of their District or out of such part or parts thereof as may be specified by the Local Authority:

(c.) For prohibiting or regulating the movement out of any stable, building, field, or other place of a horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of sarcoptic mange:

(d.) For prohibiting or regulating the movement out of any stable, building, field, or other place in which sarcoptic mange exists or is suspected to exist of a horse, ass, or mule that has been in contact with or in the same stable, building, field, or other place with a horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of sarcoptic mange:

(e.) For regulating the taking out of any stable, building, field, or other place of any fodder, litter, or other thing that has been in contact with or used for or about a horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of sarcoptic mange;

but nothing in any such Regulation shall authorize movement in contravention of Article 84 or Article 87 or other provision of The Animals Order of 1884, or in contravention of any general Order of Council for the time being in force; and a Regulation under paragraph (d.) of this Article shall operate so long only as sarcoptic mange exists in the judgment of the Local Authority in any stable, building, field, or other place to which the Regulation refers, and in case of a stable, building, or other like place, until the same has been cleansed and disinfected.

Regulations of Local Authority as to Treatment.

11. The Local Authority may, from time to

time, make Regulations for the purpose of causing any person having in his possession or under his charge a horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of sarcoptic mange to treat that horse, ass, or mule, or cause it to be treated, with some dressing or other remedy for sarcoptic mange.

Regulations of Local Authority as to Cleansing and Disinfection.

12.—(1.) The Local Authority may, from time to time, make Regulations for the following purposes, or any of them:

(a.) For providing for the cleansing and disinfection of places used by horses, asses, or mules affected with or suspected of sarcoptic

(b.) For providing for the cleansing and disinfection of walls, hurdles, fences, rubbingposts, or other things with which horses, asses, or mules affected with or suspected of sarcoptic mange have come in contact:

(c.) For providing for the cleansing and disinfection of vans or other vehicles, or of vessels, used for the carrying or moving by land or by water of horses, asses, or mules:

(d.) For prescribing the mode in which such cleansing and such disinfection are to be effected:

(e.) For providing that such places, walls, hurdles, fences, rubbing-posts, things, vans, vehicles, or vessels should be cleansed and disinfected at the expense of the Local

Authority, or of the owner, lessee, or occupier thereof.

(2.) If any person fails to cleanse and disinfect any place, or any wall, hurdle, fence, rubbing-post, or other thing, or any van or other vehicle, or any vessel, in accordance with any such Regulation, it shall be lawful for the Local Authority, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of such Regulation, to cause such place, or such wall, hurdle, fence, rubbing-post, or other thing, or such van or other vehicle, or such vessel, to be cleansed and disinfected and to recover the expenses of such cleansing and disinfection from such person in any court of competent jurisdiction.

General Provisions as to Regulations of Local Authority.

13.—(1.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Privy Council a copy of every Regulation made by them under this Order.

(2.) If the Privy Council are satisfied on inquiry with respect to any Regulation made by the Local Authority under this Order that the same is of too restrictive a character, or otherwise objectionable, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses. 14.—(1.) Every person in charge of horses, asses, or mules being moved, where, under any Regulation of the Local Authority under this Order, a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a Constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority, produce and show to him the Movement Licence, if any, authorizing the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Every person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or Constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Offences.

15.—(1.) If a horse, ass, or mule is moved in contravention of a Regulation of the Local Authority made under the authority of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of the horse, ass, or mule, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the horse, ass, or mule, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel in which it is moved, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(2.) If any person, with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by clipping, or washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark clipped, painted, or stamped on a horse, ass, or mule, as required by a Regulation made by the Local Authority under the provisions of this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the horse, ass, or mule, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(3.) If anything is omitted to be done as regards treatment of a horse, ass, or mule in contravention of a Regulation of the Local Authority made under the authority of this Order, the

owner of the horse, ass, or mule, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own omissions, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of

(4.) If anything is omitted to be done as regards cleansing or disinfection in contravention of a Regulation of the Local Authority made under the authority of this Order, the owner and the lessee and the occupier of any place or thing in or in respect of which,—and the person using the van or other vehicle in which,—and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel in which,—(as the case may be,) the same is omitted, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(5.) If a person in charge of horses, asses, or mules being moved, where, under a Regulation made by the Local Authority under the provisions of this Order, a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878. THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and with reference especially to Article 89 of The Animals Order of 1884, do hereby license the Local Authority for the county of Wilts to dig up or cause to be dug up, within fourteen days after the date of this License, the carcases of certain swine which have recently been slaughtered on account of swine-fever, and were buried in a certain six foot well in the rear of the Angel Hotel, in the town of Wootton Bassett, in the county of Wilts, subject to the following conditions:

1. The carcases shall be dug up in the presence of, and under the superintendence of, an officer specially appointed in that behalf by the Local Authority.

2. The carcases dug up shall be, as far as practicable, covered with quick lime, and shall then be removed from the said well in the rear of the Angel Hotel, and shall be re-buried in the presence of, and under the superintendence of, the said officer, as soon as possible in some proper place, and shall be covered with a sufficient quantity of quick lime or other disinfectant, and with not less than six feet of carth.

3. The expenses of and incidental to the digging up, removal, and burial of the carcases shall be defrayed by the Local Authority.

4. This License is revocable by the Privy Council.

The following Areas (namely),-(1.) the yards and buildings in the occupation of Richard Wadley, at Tynycae, Whitchurch, in the Petty Sessional Division of Kibbor, in the county of Glamorgan; and (2.) the yards and buildings in the occupation of Thomas Evans, at New House Farm, St. Fagans, in the Petty Sessional Division of Kibbor, in the county of Glamorgan,—shall continue to be and are hereby declared to be

Areas infected with swine-fever.

3. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-eighth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

Ships from suspected ports which have had cases of cholera during the voyage or susceptible cargoes will only be admitted into the port of Rio de Janeiro.

THE FAIRS ACT, 1873. GREAT TORRINGTON FAIR.

IN pursuance of the above mentioned Act, I, the Right Honourable Hugh Culling Eardley Childers, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, hereby notify as follows:

- 1. By Memorial, dated 15th July, 1886, a representation has been duly made to me by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Great Torrington, as owners, that Fairs have been annually held within the borough of Great Torrington, on the 4th of May, and the two following days, and on the eve of the 10th day of October, and two following days respectively, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the days for the holding of such Fairs should be altered, and that instead of being held as aforesaid, such Fairs should, in future, be held on the first Thursday and two following days in the month of May, and the second Thursday and two following days in the month of October in each year.
- 2. On the 23rd day of August, 1886, I shall take the aforesaid representation into consideration, and all persons are to intimate, before that day, any objection they may desire to offer to the said proposed alteration in the times for holding the said Fairs.

WHEREAS, under and by virtue of certain Treasury Warrants made in that behalf, dated respectively the 17th day of July, 1885, the 22nd day of August, 1885, the 5th day of November, 1885, the 18th day of November, 1885, the 9th day of March, 1886, Parcels not exceeding seven pounds in weight may, subject to the provisions of such Warrants respectively, be transmitted by Post from and to the United Kingdom and the following places, namely, Malta, Tobago, Ceylon, Labuan, Cape Town (Cape of Good Hope), St. Helena, and The Netherlands respectively.

And whereas arrangements have been made under which Parcels exceeding seven pounds, and not exceeding eleven pounds in weight, may be transmitted from and to the United Kingdom and the several places hereinbefore mentioned, and it is expedient to fix the rates of postage to be payable in respect thereof, and to make such other provision as is hereinafter contained.

Now we, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare, as follows:—

1. There shall be repealed, revoked, and annulled, on and as from the day upon which this Warrant comes into operation,

(1.) So much of the several Warrants hereinbefore referred to as provides that no Parcel which exceeds in weight seven pounds shall be conveyed or tendered for conveyance by post, under the provisions of the said Warrants between the United Kingdom and the places hereinbefore respectively mentioned, or as otherwise limits the weight of Parcels conveyed or tendered for conveyance by Post, under the provisions of the said Warrants, between the United Kingdom and such places respectively; and also

(2.) So much of the said several Warrants as fixes the rates of postage payable on Parcels transmitted by Post between the United Kingdom and the several places hereinbefore

mentioned.

2. On and as from the day on which this Warrant comes into operation any Parcel exceeding seven pounds but not exceeding eleven pounds in weight may be conveyed or transmitted by Post between the United Kingdom and the respective places hereinbefore mentioned, under the provisions of the several Warrants hereinbefore referred to as amended by this Warrant, but no Parcel exceeding eleven pounds in weight shall be so conveyed or transmitted.

3. On and as from the day on which this Warrant comes into operation there shall be charged and paid on all Parcels transmitted by Post between the several places mentioned in the Schedule hereto under the provisions of the several Warrants hereinbefore referred to as amended by this Warrant the rates of postage specified in

such Schedule.

4. The rates of postage fixed by this Warrant, on Parcels transmitted by the Post as herein respectively mentioned, shall be deemed to be mentioned or referred to in lieu of the rates fixed by the several Warrants hereinbefore mentioned wherever in the said Warrants the last mentioned rates of postage are mentioned or referred to.

5. This Warrant shall be read as one with the several Warrants hereinbefore mentioned, and terms to which a meaning is prescribed in the said Warrants, shall have the same meaning

when used in this Warrant.

6. This Warrant shall come into operation on the day after the date of its publication in the London Gazette.

War Office, July 27, 1886. SHOEBURYNESS RANGES.

BYE-LAWS under the Artillery and Rifle Ranges Act, 1885, made by Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department, with the consent of the Board of Trade.

1. THE shore of the War Department property at Shoeburyness down to high-water mark, and the adjoining foreshore southward and eastward thereof to the low-water mark of spring tides, shall within the boundaries hereinafter mentioned be closed to all persons while firing is going on at the School of Gunnery there, and at all such other times as the Commandant for the time being of the said School shall think fit.

2. The signal that the shore and foreshore within the said boundaries are closed will be a red flag, hoisted at the east and west end of the shore of the War Department property.

3. The said boundaries of the area of shore and foreshore, which will be thus closed, are as follows:

West Shore. The railing which runs from the west edge of the War Department property to high-water mark.

Fore-Shore. The line of this railing produced (about S.W. by S.), through a chicken-coop buoy to the said low-water mark.

East Shore. The railing in prolongation of the wall which bounds the War Department property, and extending to high-water mark.

Fore-Shore. The line of buoys (already laid down) running about E.N.E. from the afore-

said railing, and extending to the said lowwater mark.

4. During any such time as the said area shall be closed as aforesaid, all intrusion thereon and all obstruction to the use thereof as an Artillery Range, and for any other purpose of the said School, is hereby prohibited.

5. During any such time as aforesaid, no person shall without the consent of the said Commandant come or remain on the said area, nor shall any vehicle, animal, vessel, or thing be without such consent brought or taken, or by the owner or any other person in charge thereof suffered to remain on the said area.

6. The said Commandant, and any Officer or Non-commissioned Officer for the time being under his command, and any Constable, shall have power and he is hereby authorized—

(1.) To remove from the said area, and take into custody without Warrant, and bring before a Court of Summary Jurisdiction, as mentioned in the said Act, to be dealt with according to law, any person contravening any of these Bye-laws.

(2.) To remove from the said area any vehicle, animal, vessel, or thing found therein in contravention of any of these Bye-laws, and any such vehicle, animal, vessel, or thing shall be liable to forfeiture as mentioned in the said Act.

7. For all purposes of these Bye-laws the foreshore within the said area shall be taken to include all sea and water for the time being thereon: Provided, that barges and other vessels employed in local trade shall be allowed to exercise all rights of navigation as heretofore, subject only to the restrictions as to grounding and anchoring imposed by the Artillery Ranges Acts of 1862 and 1882.

8. Any person contravening any of these Byelaws shall be deemed to commit an offence against the same, and is under the said Act liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding five pounds.
