THE following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the School Board for the parish of Queenborough, as settled by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in pursuance of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:-

WHEREAS on the twenty-ninth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty was pleased by Royal Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the parish of Queenborough.

"And whereas Her Majesty by Her Order in Council of the twelfth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, was pleased to confirm the Borough of Queenborough Scheme, 1885.

"And whereas at the date of the said Charter there was in existence a School Board for the said parish, and the said School Board is a Local Authority within the meaning of the Municipal

Corporation Acts, 1882 and 1885.

"And whereas, on the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, the Municipal Corporation of the borough of Queenborough did, by the Council of the said borough, under the provisions of the Municipal Corporation Acts, 1882 and 1885, petition Her Majesty in Council that an Amending Scheme may be settled under the said Acts.

"And whereas the said petition was referred to a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Privy Council, and such petition has been proceeded on as nearly as may be as if the same were a petition for a Charter extending the Municipal Corporations Acts to a Municipal Borough to be incorporated.

"And whereas this Scheme was before being settled by the Committee of Council referred to the consideration of the Committee of the Lords of the Privy Council on Education (hereinafter referred to as the Education Department).

"And whereas it is expedient, right, and just, that a Scheme should be settled under the provisions of the Municipal Corporation Acts, 1882 and 1885, containing the provisions hereinafter set forth :-

"Now, therefore, the said Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby order and declare as

follows:—
"1. This Scheme may be cited for all purposes
Scheme 1886. as the Borough of Queenborough Scheme, 1886.

"2. This Scheme shall be deemed to have commenced on the date of the commencement of the Borough of Queenborough Scheme, 1885, which ! THE date is hereinafter referred to as 'the commencement of this Scheme,' and shall be in operation as soon as it is confirmed by Order in Council or

by Parliament as the case may be.
"3. Notwithstanding the creation of the Municipal Borough of Queenborough, the School Board for the parish of Queenborough shall be and continue to be the School Board for the Municipal Borough of Queenborough, by the name of the School Board of the Borough of Queenborough, in all respects to the same extent, and in the same manner as if, at the time of the formation of the School Board for the said parish of Queenborough, by the Education Department, the said Borough of Queenborough had been created a Municipal Borough, and the School Board of the parish of Queenborough had been formed and created for the said borough by the name of the School Board of the borough of Queenborough, and as if the Local Rate and the Rating Authority had been the Borough Fund or Rate, and the Council of the said borough, respectively, and everything in connection with the said Board and School District shall be done, and had accordingly and not otherwise.

"4. All liabilities and assets attaching to and vested in the School Board for the parish of Queenborough immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall be, and continue, attached to, and vested in the School Board for the borough of Queenborough, and all charges charged on the Poor Rate and School Fund of the said parish immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall be a charge upon the Borough Rate or Fund of the borough of Queenborough, and upon the School Fund of the School Board for the said borough, respectively, and not otherwise.

"5. Any bye-laws in force at the date of this Scheme in the said School District of the said parish, and made under the Acts relating to Public Elementary Education shall continue in

"6. Any act or omission done or made by the Education Department or the said School Board for the parish of Queenborough or the Council of the said borough or any Justice since the date of the said Charter shall be deemed to have been lawfully done or made if it might have been lawfully done or made by the said Education Department, School Board, Council, or Justice if no Charter had been granted, or the said School Board had been the School Board for the borough of Queenborough."
