Vice-Chancellor Bacon.

In the Matter of the Companies Acts, 1867 and

1877, and in the Matter of the Woolwich and South East London Tramways Company Limited.

NOTICE is hereby given, that by an Order of the High Court of Justice, made by Vice-Chancellor Bacon on the 31st day of July, 1886, in the above-mentioned matter, it was ordered that the Special Resolution passed at an Extraordinary General Meeting of the petitioners, the said Company, held on the 25th February, 1886, and confirmed at an Extraordinary General Meeting of the said Company, held on the 17th March, 1886, which resolution was in the words and figures following, that is to say:—"That the capital of the Company, which now consists of £70,000, divided into 14,000 shares of £5 each, whereof 11,672 have been issued as ordinary shares and are fully paid up, two have been issued in respect of which 10s. only has been paid up on each share, and such two shares have since been forfeited, 405 have been issued as preference A shares entitled to a fixed cumulative preference dividend of £6 per cent. per annum, and the remainder are unissued, be reduced to £58,000, to be divided into 14,000 shares, whereof 12,000 are to be ordinary shares of £4 each, having as to said 11,672 already issued, £4 paid upon each share, the remaining 328 being as to two thereof forfeited, and as to 326 never having been issued, 600 are to be preference A shares of £5 each, entitled to a fixed cumulative preference dividend of £6 per cent. per annum, and having as to the 405 already issued £5 paid up on each, and the remaining 1,400 are to be of £5 each, and to be in all respects subject to the Extraordinary Resolution of the Company passed on the 27th day of March, 1885; and that such reduction be effected by cancelling paid up capital which is not represented by available assets to the extent of £1 per share on each of the 11,672 ordinary shares already issued and fully paid up, and by reducing the nominal amount of the 328 ordinary shares, residue of 12,000 ordinary shares, from £5 to £4 each with nothing credited as paid up in respect of any of such 328 shares," be confirmed. And it was ordered that the addition of the words "and Reduced" to the title of the above-mentioned Company be altogether dispensed with. And notice is hereby also given, that the said Order has been produced to the Registrar of Joint Stock Companies, and an office copy thereof has been delivered to him, together with a Minute approved by the said Judge, in the words and figures following, namely:—"The capital of the Woolwich and South East London Tramways Company Limited is £58,000, divided into 12,000 ordinary shares of £4 each, and 2,000 new shares of £5 each, created by resolution of the Company passed on the 27th March, 1885." At the date of the registration of this Minute, 11,672 of the said 12,000 ordinary shares of £4 each are to be deemed fully paid up, and the remaining 328 are unissued. Of the said 2,000 new shares of £5 each, 600 are preference A shares, whereof 422 shares are to be deemed fully paid up, 70 are to be deemed to have £1 each paid up thereon, three are to be deemed to have nothing paid thereon, and the remaining 105 of such preference A shares, 1,400 of such new shares have never been issued; and such Order and Minute have been duly registered by the said Registrar of Joint Stock Companies.—Dated this 16th day of August, 1886.
