RIOT (DAMAGES) ACT, 1886, Section 8.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS AS TO CLAIMS FOR
COMPENSATION.*Borough of Bristol.*

WHEREAS the Police Authority for the borough of Bristol, by Order, dated the 23rd of July, 1886, being within one month from the passing of the Riot (Damages) Act, 1886, declared that claims for compensation under that Act might be made in respect of losses sustained within the borough during the twelve months next before the passing of the said Act.

Now I, the Right Honourable Henry Matthews, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, hereby declare that the General Regulations made on the 28th of July, 1886, as to claims for compensation, shall apply to claims for compensation to be made in pursuance of the said Order of the Police Authority of the borough of Bristol, with the exception of Regulation 2, for which shall be substituted the following:—

"All claims shall be delivered within fourteen clear days after the publication of these Special Regulations in the London Gazette, provided that the Police Authority, on application to be made before the expiration of fourteen days, may, for special cause shown, increase the period from fourteen days to twenty-one days; and in the event of such application being refused, the applicant may, within seven days after such refusal, apply to the Secretary of State, and his decision shall be conclusive as to whether the claim shall be received."

In the High Court of Justice.—Chancery Division.
In the Matter of the Companies Acts, 1862 and 1867; and in the Matter of the Belfast Central Railway (Sale) Act, 1885; and in the Matter of the Belfast Central Railway Company.
