WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction consisting of certain yearly tithe commutation rent-charges, amounting together to ninety pounds three shillings and five pence, which have been permanently secured to the vicarage of Trentham, in the county of Stafford, and in the diocese of Lichfield, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, grant to
