THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs information to the following effect as regards the quarantine regulations for vessels desiring to enter the Bosphorus from the Black Sea, viz.:—All vessels arriving during the night and all vessels arriving during the day from places against which quarantine is established must apply for pratique at Cavak. In the event of their attempting to proceed without doing so, they will

be summoned to stop by a blank charge fired from one of the forts, and should they disregard this they will be liable to be fired upon.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Constantinople, reporting that all arrivals from Raab and Pesh and other ports in the Danube, as far as and including Sulina, since the 12th instant, will be subjected at Cavak and in the other Ottoman ports of the Black Sea where there is a health officer to five full days' quarantine of observation. These vessels may, however, leave their passengers at the lazaret at Cavak, and pursue their voyages under the surveillance of two health guards, whom they will leave at the Dardanelles.
