WHEREAS by the provisions of the Patents, Designs, and Trade Marks Act, 1883, it is, amongst other things, provided :—

That if Her Majesty is pleased to make any arrangement with the Government or Governments of any Foreign State or States for mutual protection of inventions, designs, and trade marks, or any of them, then any person who has applied for protection for any invention, design, or trade mark in any such State shall, subject to the conditions further provided and set forth in the said Act, be entitled to a patent for his invention, or to registration of his design or trade mark (as the case may be) under the said Act in priority to other applicants, and such patent or registration shall have the same date as the date of the protection obtained in such Foreign State :

And whereas it has pleased Her Majesty to make an arrangement of the nature contemplated by the said Act by and in virtue of a declaration signed and sealed by Her Majesty's Ambassador at Paris on the seventeenth March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, duly conveying the accession of Great Britain to the International Convention and Protocol for the Protection of Industrial Property, signed by representatives of certain Powers on the twentieth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, and duly ratified on the sixth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, power being reserved to Her Majesty to hereafter accede to the provisions of the said Convention and Protocol on behalf of the Isle of Man, the Channel Islands, and any of Her Majesty's Possessions, which Declaration of Accession was duly accepted by the French Government on behalf of the Signatory Powers by and in virtue of a Declaration dated the second of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four :

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased by an Order in Council, dated the twenty-sixth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, to declare that the provisions of the said Act hereinbefore specified should apply to the several countries mentioned in the said Order ; and it was further ordered and declared that such Order should take effect from the seventh day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four :

And whereas it has been intimated to Her Majesty's Government that the Government of the Republic of Salvador, one of the said several countries so mentioned, has by a Note on their behalf, dated the seventeenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and addressed to the Government of the Swiss Con-

ederation, given notice of the termination of adhesion to the said Convention : and whereas by Article eighteen of the said Convention it is provided that the provisions of the said Convention shall remain in force as regards any country so terminating its adhesion till the expiry of one year from the date of such notice :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority committed to Her by the said Act, doth declare, and it is hereby declared, that the provisions of the said Act hereinbefore specified shall cease to apply to the said country, viz.,

Salvador.

And it is further ordered and declared that this Order shall take effect from the seventeenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the tenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intitled "An Act for the more easy recovery of small debts and demands in England," it is, among other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that the said Act be put in force in such county or counties as to Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, should seem fit, and to divide the whole or part of any such county (including all counties of cities, and counties of towns, cities, boroughs, towns, ports, and places, liberties, and franchises therein contained or thereunto adjoining) into districts ; and to order that the County Court should be holden for the recovery of debts and demands, under the said Act, in each of such districts ; and, from time to time, to alter such districts, as to Her Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, should seem fit ; and, from time to time, with the advice aforesaid, to declare by what name, and in what towns and places, the County Court should be holden in each district :

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, by an Order in Council, of the ninth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, to order that the said Act be put in force in the counties and places therein specified, and the same was put in force accordingly :

And whereas by certain other Acts made and passed in the thirteenth, in the fourteenth, in the sixteenth, in the twentieth, in the twenty-second, in the twenty-ninth, in the thirty-first, and in the thirty-ninth years of the reign of Her Majesty, the provisions of the said recited Act have been amended and extended :

And whereas it has been represented that it would be of advantage to the public if the County Court of Glamorganshire, holden at Pontypridd, were ordered to be holden at Ystradyfodwg as well as at Pontypridd :

Her Majesty, having taken the premises into consideration, is thereupon pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the thirtieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, the County Court of Glamorganshire, holden at Pontypridd, shall be holden at Ystradyfodwg as well as at Pontypridd.
