(SWINE-FEVER.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 29th day of September, 1886.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The following Area (namely),—the borough of Newport (Isle of Wight),—which was declared by Order of Council dated the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirtieth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the third day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

SCHEDULE.

An Area in the county of Southampton, comprised within the following boundary, that is to say, commencing at a point at the parish boundary between Froxfield and Privett at Fishers Copse in a north-easterly direction along the said parish boundary to the Basing Dean-road, thence

along the said road to the foot of Tallywater Hill, proceeding thence along the Barnet Side-lane to its junction with Green-lane, thence along Green-lane in a north-westerly direction to the road leading to Alexanders farm, thence in a north or north-easterly direction along the said last-mentioned road to the main-road leading from the Trooper Inn to Edge Corner, thence along the said main-road to Edge Corner aforesaid, thence along the London and Gosport-road in the direction of Westmeon to The Jumps, thence along Fawley-lane till it joins Hempland-lane, thence along the said lane to Malthouse farm to its junction with the boundary line between the parishes of Froxfield and Privett aforesaid, and thence along the said boundary line to the point at Fishers Copse aforesaid: the said roads not being included in the Area.

Whereas We have deemed it expedient that a Commission should forthwith issue to inquire and report to what extent, if any, and in what parts of that portion of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland called Ireland the operation of the Land Law (Ireland) Act, 1881, is affected either by combinations to resist the enforcement of legal obligations, or by an exceptional fall in the price of produce; and also to inquire and report to what extent there exists any general desire among tenants to avail themselves of the provisions of the Purchase

of Land (Ireland) Act, 1885, and whether the operation of that Act might be expedited and extended, especially in the congested districts, by providing security, through the intervention of Local Authorities, for loans advanced from public funds for the purchase of land; and also to report whether any modifications of the law are necessary:

Now know ye, that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your knowledge, discretion, and ability, have authorized and appointed, and by these presents do authorize and appoint you, the said Francis Thomas De Grey, Earl Cowper, Edward Nugent, Earl of Milltown, Sir James Caird, John Chute Neligan, and George Fottrell, to be Our Commissioners for the purpose aforesaid.

And for the better effecting the purposes of this Our Commission, We do by these presents authorize and empower you, or any two or more of you, to call before you, or any two or more of you, such persons as you may judge necessary to examine, and by whom you may be the better informed in the several matters hereby submitted for your consideration, and everything connected therewith, and generally to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever; and also to call for, have access to, and examine, such books, documents, papers, writings, or records as you, or any two or more of you, shall judge likely to afford the fullest information concerning the several matters hereby submitted for your consideration.

And We also by these presents authorize and empower you, or any two or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you, or any two or more of you, may deem expedient for the more effectually carrying out the purposes aforesaid.

And Our further will and pleasure is that you, or any two or more of you, do report to Us, with all convenient speed, in writing under your hands and seals, your several proceedings by virtue of this Our Commission, and what you shall find touching or concerning the premises, together with your opinion upon the matters hereby referred for your consideration.

And We further will and command and by these presents ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our Commissioners, do from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And for your further assistance in the execution of these presents, We do hereby appoint Our trusty and well-beloved Francis George Hodder, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, to be Secretary to this Our Commission, and We require you to use his services and assistance from time to time, as occasion may require.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Lisbon, enclosing translation of a Decree, directing the Custom House authorities of Portugal and the adjacent Islands to enforce stringently the regulations with regard to Bills of Lading and Manifests in the case of cargoes of timber in boards (Tabuado). The regulations in question require that Bills of Lading should specify the number of parcels, weight, or dimensions of the same, and the amount of freight; and Manifests, besides tallying exactly with the Bills of Lading as regards the above particulars, must state the value of the merchandise as well as its origin, and in addition to the signature of the Captain of the vessel, must be certified by the Portuguese Consul at the port from which the goods were brought.

Captains will be liable for any omission of the above particulars to the penalties laid down in the Portuguese fiscal laws and regulations.

WHEREAS, under and by virtue of a certain Treasury Warrant made in that behalf, dated the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, Parcels not exceeding seven pounds in weight may, subject to the provisions of such Warrant, be transmitted by Post between the United Kingdom and Norway.

And whereas arrangements have been made, under which Parcels exceeding seven pounds, and not exceeding eleven pounds in weight, may be transmitted between the said countries, and it is expedient to fix the rates of postage to be payable in respect thereof, and to make such other provision as is hereinafter contained.

Now We, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows :—

1. There shall be repealed, revoked, and annulled, on and as from the day upon which this Warrant comes into operation,

(1.) So much of the Warrant hereinbefore referred to, as provides that no Parcel which exceeds in weight seven pounds, shall be conveyed or tendered for conveyance by Post, under the provisions of the said Warrant, or as otherwise limits the weight of Parcels conveyed or tendered for conveyance by Post, under the provisions of the said Warrant; and also,

(2.) So much of the said Warrant as fixes the rates of postage payable on Parcels transmitted by Post from the United Kingdom to Norway.

2. On and as from the day on which this Warrant comes into operation, any Parcel exceeding seven pounds but not exceeding eleven pounds in weight, may be conveyed or transmitted by Post between the United Kingdom and Norway, under the provisions of the said Warrant, as amended by this Warrant, but no Parcel exceeding eleven pounds in weight shall be so conveyed or transmitted.

3. On and as from the day on which this Warrant comes into operation, there shall be charged and paid on all Parcels transmitted by Post from the United Kingdom to Norway the following rates of postage, that is to say :—

On every Parcel not exceeding three pounds in weight, ten pence halfpenny.

On every Parcel exceeding three pounds and not exceeding seven pounds in weight, one shilling and five pence halfpenny.

On every Parcel exceeding seven pounds and not exceeding eleven pounds in weight, two shillings and one penny.

4. The rates of postage fixed by this Warrant on Parcels transmitted by the Post as herein mentioned shall be deemed to be mentioned or referred to in lieu of the rates fixed by the Warrant hereinbefore mentioned wherever, in the said Warrant, the last-mentioned rates of postage are mentioned or referred to.

5. This Warrant shall be read as one with the said Warrant; and terms to which a meaning is prescribed in the said Warrant shall have the same meaning when used in this Warrant.

6. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Amending Regulations with respect to Remuneration of Vaccination Officer:—

Warrington Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Warrington Union, in the counties of Lancaster and Chester;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS We, the Local Government Board, by a General Order bearing date the thirty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, made rules and regulations relating to the appointment of Vaccination Officers and Assistants to Vaccination Officers by Guardians of the Poor of certain Unions and Parishes, including the said Warrington Union; and by Article 9 of that Order it was provided as follows :—

“ The Guardians shall pay to any Vaccination Officer such salary or remuneration, and such only, as the Local Government Board may direct or approve, whether for ordinary duties or for occasional services; and such salary or remuneration may be increased or reduced as that Board may from time to time direct or approve.”

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Order as hereinafter mentioned, so far as regards the said Warrington Union :

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order that with respect to the said Warrington Union, the above-cited Article shall be amended by the addition of the following proviso :—

Provided that the Guardians, with the approval of the Local Government Board, may pay to any Vaccination Officer or Assistant Vaccination Officer a reasonable compensation on account of extraordinary services, or other unforeseen circumstances connected with his duties or the necessities of the said Union.

By His Excellency Sir Frederick Napier Broome, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS under the provisions of an Act of the Legislative Council, passed in the 43rd year of the reign of Her present Majesty, numbered 23, intituled "An Act for the prevention of the Importation of Diseased Stock," the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, is empowered by Proclamation to prohibit the introduction into the Colony, either by land or sea, of any cattle within the meaning of the said Act and of "The Cattle Diseases Ordinance, 1865," and "The Imported Stock Act, 1876," or either of them: Now therefore I, the said Governor, in exercise of such power and of all
