(PORT OF GLASGOW.—APPROVAL OF LANDING-PLACE FOR FOREIGN ANIMALS.)

T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 11th day of October, 1886.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby approve of the following part of the Port of Glasgow as a Landing-Place for foreign animals not subject to slaughter or quarantine: All that space in the Port of Glasgow being part of the lands of Shieldhall belonging to the

Trustees of the Clyde Navigation situate on the south bank of the river Clyde, bounded by a line commencing at a point on the coping of the river wall on the south bank of the river Clyde distant forty feet or thereabouts westward from the boundary between the said lands of Shieldhall and Linthouse Shipbuilding-yard; thence passing in a westerly direction along the coping of the river wall for a distance of fifty-four feet three

inches or thereabouts; thence northward along the coping of a dolphin or jetty for a distance of twelve feet ten inches or thereabouts; thence westward along the said coping for a distance of eight feet six inches or thereabouts; thence southward along the said coping for a distance of twelve feet ten inches or thereabouts; thence westward along the coping of the river wall for a distance of eighty-seven feet six inches or thereabouts; thence northward along the coping of a jetty for a distance of twenty-five feet nine inches or thereabouts; thence westward along the said coping for a distance of fourteen feet or thereabouts; thence southward along the said coping for a distance of twenty-five feet nine inches or thereabouts; thence westward along the coping of the river wall for a distance of eighty-eight feet five inches or thereabouts; thence northward along the coping of a jetty for a distance of twenty-five feet two inches or thereabouts; thence

westward along the said coping for a distance of fourteen feet or thereabouts; thence southward

along the said coping for a distance of twenty-

five feet two inches or thereabouts: thence westward along the coping of the river wall for a distance of eighty-eight feet five inches or there-

wharf for a distance of twenty-five feet ten inches or thereabouts; thence westward along the coping which forms the water edge of the said wharf for a distance of one hundred and four feet seven inches or thereabouts; thence in a southerly direction at right angles to the last-described boundary for a distance of thirty-six feet or thereabouts; thence eastward at right angles to the last-described boundary for a distance of four hundred and thirty-one feet or thereabouts measuring along a wooden fence; thence southward along a wooden fence for a distance of four hundred and thirteen feet or thereabouts; thence westward along a brick wall at right angles to the last-described boundary for a distance of three hundred and eight feet or thereabouts; thence southward along a brick wall at right angles to the last-described boundary for a distance of four hundred and twenty feet or thereabouts; thence eastward along a brick wall at right angles to the last-described boundary for a distance of three hundred and eight feet or thereabouts; thence southward along a wooden fence at right angles to the last-described boundary for a distance of three hundred and twelve feet or thereabouts till it intersects the north side of the turnpike-road from Renfrew to Glasgow; thence eastward along the north side of the said turnpike-road for a distance of thirty-three feet or thereabouts; thence northward along a wooden fence situate forty feet westward from the boundary between the lands of Shieldhall and Linthouse Shipbuilding-yard for a distance of eleven hundred and sixty-two feet or thereabouts till it reaches the coping of the river wall on the south bank of the river Clyde at the point first de-scribed; all which space is coloured red on the plan thereof deposited for the purposes of this Order at the Privy Council Office, copies of which are deposited at the offices of the Clerk of Supply for the county of Lanark and of the Town Clerk of the burgh of Glasgow.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and abouts; thence northward along the coping of a in exercise of the powers in them vested under

The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The limits of the following Places which are declared by orders of the Local Authority acting in and for the county of Fife to be Places infected with pleuro-pneumonia (namely), -(1.) a Loose Box situated next the corn-yard at the farm steading of Lathallan Home Farm, in the parish of Kilconquhar, and occupation of the Trustees of the late Stamford Robert Lumsdaine; (2:) a field known as East Slope on the said Home Farm of Lathallan, in the said parish of Kilconquhar, and occupation of the said Trustees; and (3.) the field known as the Path Mouth on the said Home Farm of Lathallan, in the said parish of Kilconquhar, and occupation of the said Trustees,—are hereby extended so as to include the Place described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Place described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the sixteenth day of October, one

thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

SCHEDULE.

A Place comprising the whole of the farm steading and lands on the Home Farm of Lathallan, in the parish of Kilconquhar, in the county of Fife, in the occupation of the Trustees of the late Stamford Robert Lumsdaine, consisting of the East Slope Field and the other fields of the said farm all contiguous on the north side of the road leading eastwards from Cairn to the highway from Largoward to Colinsburgh, and bounded on the north by the highway from Largoward by Gilston to Largo, on the west by the lands of Cairn, on the south by the said road leading eastwards from Cairn, and on the east partly by the said highway from Largoward to Colinsburgh and partly by lands in the occupation of Peter Johnston and of Thomas Brown and Son; also the said road leading eastwards from Cairn so far as south of the fields herein before described; and also the Path Mouth Field, House Park, and other fields on Lathallan Home Farm south of the said road from Cairn, and bounded by the said road from Cairn on the north, the lands of Rires on the south, the garden and plantations of Lathallan House on the east, and the lands of Cairn on the west, including the whole farm steading, and farm buildings, stackyard, and roads within the said boundaries.

THE FOREIGN ANIMALS AMENDMENT No. 3 ORDER OF 1886.

A T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 15th day of October, 1886.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 and 1884, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1.—(1.) Unless the Privy Council otherwise order, animals brought from the Kingdom of Norway shall not be landed in England or Wales or Scotland.

(2.) The Foreign Animals Order of 1885 shall be read and have effect as if the Kingdom of Norway was included in the list of Prohibited Countries named in Part I. of the First Schedule to that Order and was not included in the list of Free Countries named in Part I. of the Second Schedule to that Order.

The Foreign Animals Amendment No. 2
 Order of 1886, dated the twenty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty six, is

hereby revoked.

3. The following provisions of this Article shall be read in the place of Article 28 of The Foreign Animals Order of 1885, and during the continuance of that Order such provisions shall be deemed to be Article 28 of that Order (namely):

Conditions of Landing.

28.—(1.) The landing of foreign animals at a Landing-Place under the provisions of this Chapter is subject to the following conditions:

First. That the vessel in which they are imported has not, within twenty-eight days before taking them on board, had on board any animal exported or carried coastwise from a port or place in any country other than in Her Majesty's Possessions in North America, or in Iceland, or in the Channel Islands, or in the Isle of Man, or (subject to the second condition of this Article) in Denmark or in Sweden.

Second. That the vessel in which they are imported has not, within twenty-cight days before taking them on board, had on board any swine exported or carried coastwise from a port or place in Denmark or in Sweden.

Third. That the vessel has not within twentyone days before taking them on board or at
any time since taking on board the animals
imported, entered any port or place in any
country other than in Her Majesty's Possessions in North America, or in Iceland, or in
the Channel Islands, or in the Isle of Man,
or in Denmark, or in Sweden, or in the
United States of America.

Fourth. That the animals imported have not, while on board the vessel, been in contact with any animal exported or carried coastwise from any port or place in any country other than in Her Majesty's Possessions in North America, or in Iceland, or in the Channel Islands, or in the Isle of Man, or (subject to the fifth condition of this Article) in Denmark or in Sweden.

Fifth. That the animals imported have not while on board the vessel been in contact with any swine exported or carried coastwise from a port or place in Denmark or in Sweden.

(2.) And the animals imported shall not be landed at a Landing-Place unless and until—

(a.) The owner or charterer of the vessel in which they are imported, or his agent in England or Wales or Scotland, has entered into a bond to Her Majesty the Queen, in a sum not exceeding one thousand pounds, with or without a surety or sureties, to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Customs, conditioned for the observance of the foregoing conditions; and

(b.) The master of the vessel has on each occasion of importation of foreign animals therein satisfied the Commissioners of Customs, or their proper officer, by declaration made and signed or otherwise, that all the animals then imported therein are properly imported according to the provisions of this Article

4. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under The Foreign Animals Amendment No. 2 Order of 1886 hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, The Foreign Animals Amendment No. 2 Order of 1886 hereby revoked.

5. In this Order terms have the same meaning as in The Foreign Animals Order of 1885.

6. This Order may be cited as THE FOREIGN ANIMALS AMENDMENT No. 3 ORDER OF 1886.

7. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the eighteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

And We do give and grant to you, or to any three or more of you, full power and authority to call before you and to examine all persons whom you may consider competent, by reason of their knowledge, habits, or experience, to afford you information on the subject of your enquiry, and of every matter connected therewith; and We do hereby empower you to call for, have access to, and examine all such official books, papers, and records as may appear to you, or to any three or more of you, likely to be of use in affording you the fullest information:

And We do further by these presents give and grant unto you, or any three or more of you, full power and authority, when the same shall appear to be requisite, to administer an oath to any person whatsoever to be examined before you, or any three or more of you, touching or concerning

the premises:

And We do hereby require and command you, or any three or more of you, to enquire into and report to Us under your hands and seals, with all convenient speed, upon the system under which the patterns of warlike stores are adopted and the stores obtained and passed for Our Service, and whether any improvement can be effected in that system:

Also to enquire into and report to Us upon the complaints which may have been made since the first day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, as to any warlike stores

then or now in use in Our Service:

Also to report to Us as to the persons—if any—responsible for any defects which you may find to have existed during the same period in the warlike stores passed into Our Service:

And We Will and Command, and by these presents ordain, that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment:

And, We hereby command all and singular Our Justices of the Peace, Sheriffs, Mayors, Bailiffs, Constables, Officers, Ministers, and all other Our loving subjects whatsoever, as well within liberties as without, that they be assistant to you and each of you in the execution of these

presents:

And for your assistance in the due execution of this Our Commission, We have made choice of Our trusty and well-beloved James Alleyne, Esquire, Colonel in Our Army, to be Secretary to this Our Commission, and to attend you, whose services and assistance, as well as the services and assistance of such clerks and other persons as may appear to you to be necessary, We require you to use from time to time as occasion shall require.

Given at Our Court at Balmoral, this twenty-seventh day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, in the fiftieth year of Our reign.

From and after the date when this Warrant comes into operation, Parcels not exceeding six pounds in weight may, subject to the provisions of this Warrant, be transmitted by Post between Hong Kong (including any place in China from which the Hong Kong Post Office may receive Parcels for transmission, or to which such Post Office may forward Parcels), or the Straits Settlements and Germany, and any country or place via Germany, to which the German Post Office may forward Parcels, or from which such lastmentioned Post Office may receive parcels for transmission.

Rates of Postage.

3. On all Parcels posted in Hong Kong, or any place in China from which the Hong Kong Post Office receives Parcels for transmission, or in the Straits Settlements, respectively, addressed to Germany, or any country via Germany to which the German Post Office may forward Parcels, and

transmitted by the routes respectively mentioned in the schedule hereto, without passing through the United Kingdom, there shall be charged and paid the respective rates of postage specified in such schedule.

Maximum Dimensions and Weight.

4. No Parcel, the dimensions of which shall exceed in any direction two feet, or which shall exceed in weight six pounds, shall be conveyed or tendered for conveyance by post under this Warrant.

Prepayment

5. The postage chargeable under this Warrant shall in all cases be prepaid at the time of posting.

Mode of Posting.

6. Subject to the provisions of this Warrant, all Parcels addressed to Germany or any country viâ Germany shall be posted, forwarded, conveyed, and delivered, under and subject to all such regulations, conditions, and restrictions as the Post Office Authorities in Hong Kong and the Straits Settlements respectively, with the approval of Her Majesty's Postmaster - General, may from time to time prescribe.

Commencement of Warrant.

7. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

(No. 235.)—South Pacific Ocean. Tonga or Friendly Islands-Information Concerning Certain Reported Dangers.

THE United States Government has published the following information—the result of a search made by Commander B. F. Day, U.S. vessel of war "Mohican"—concerning certain reported dangers lying in the western part of Tonga or Friendly Islands :-

(1.) Home Shoal.—On 1st July, 1886, the "Mohican" passed close to a small shoal marked by a line of breakers, extending about 50 feet in a north-east and south-west direction, with deep water around; from the colour of the water on the shoal the least depth appeared to be about four fathoms.

Position, lat. 19° 1′ 48″ S., long. 174° 44′ 25″ W. This shoal is considered to be Home Shoal, being about 21 miles northward of the assigned position, which was passed within half a mile by the "Mohican" without any signs of shoal water being seen, the weather being clear and favourable for observation.

(2.) The small volcanic island, variously reported as Wesley Rock, Metis Rock, and Mechanic Island, was searched for.

An island (Metis Island), about 300 yards long in a north-west and south-east direction, and 151 high, was found in lat. 19° 13′ 20″ S., long. 174° 48′ 50″ W. Its crater is on the western side, and is open to the water's edge; a thin column of smoke was ascending from it. There are no outlying breakers, but discoloured water extends about one mile north-west from the island, and a little less than one mile to the southward and south-eastward.

(3.) St. Michael Shoal.—This danger was searched for but not seen.

The master of the steam vessel "Janet Nicholl" reports that in proceeding from Vavu Island to Tongatábu Island, he always passes over the assigned position of this shoal, and has never seen any indications of its existence.

St. Michael Shoal (P.D.) is for the present retained on the Admiralty charts.

(4.) The "Mohican" passed over the position of the small island marked E.D. in lat. 20° 9' S., long. 175° 12′ W.; also of Culebras Reef, 1781, P.D., in lat. 20° 22′ S., long. 175° 18′ W., without any indications of these dangers being seen.

They have consequently been removed from

the Admiralty charts.

(5.) Falcon Island. — This volcanic island, which appeared in October, 1885, and forms the subject of Notice to Mariners, No. 7 of 1886, is $1\frac{4}{10}$ miles long in a north-west and south-east direction, and 164 feet high. Reefs extend from the island in three directions; off the south-east end about one mile in a south-easterly direction; off the north-east end about 7 cables N.N.E.; and off the west side 14 miles N.W. by W. The crater is on the eastern end of the island, and at

the time of the "Mohican's" visit, a dense colum of smoke and steam was rising, which could b

seen a long distance.

Position, lat. 20° 19' S., long. 175° 21½' W., or 9 miles northward of the former approximate position, given in Notice to Mariners, No. 7 of 1886.

(6.) The positions marked discoloured water, and breakers reported, 1875, about 12 miles northwest of Tongatábu Island, were examined, but no indications of discoloured water or breakers were

These dangers are for the present retained on

the Admiralty charts.

Caution.—As volcanic agency is now parti-cularly active in the area westward of the Tonga Islands, mariners should be especially cautious when navigating in the vicinity.

(7.) Tongatábu Island.—The land in the vicinity of and a short distance westward of Cook Point the south extreme of the island, gradually rises to a height of fully 200 feet a short distance inland.

The reef off Cook Point extends about one cable farther than shown on the charts.

Euaji Island.—Breakers extend a considerable distance in an easterly direction from the eastern side of Euaji Island. Vessels should not pass the

east or south side of this island nearer than $1\frac{1}{3}$ miles.

(8.) Vavu Island.—The Bare Tree shown on plan of Nei-Afo anchorage (plan of Vavu Group, No. 2357), no longer exists, nor is the red patch now distinguishable; the R. C.
