(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

**A**T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 16th day of October, 1886.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the eighteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

SCHEDULE.

An Area in the county of Warwick, comprising all the lands and buildings lying between a line drawn from the Beggars Well on the Coleshill and Tamworth-road to the point where the Gossey-lane enters the said Coleshill and Tamworth-road, thence along the Gossey-lane to the Forge Mills Railway Station, thence along the Midland Railway to the Jack O'Watton Railway Bridge, thence along the Coleshill and Tamworth-road to the point where the Jack O'Watton-lane leads to Water Orton, thence along the Jack O'Watton-lane to the Green-lane leading into the main-road from Water Orton to Coleshill, and thence along the Water Orton and Coleshill main-road to the Beggars Well: the said roads (excepting the main-road from Coleshill to Water Orton) being included in the Area.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in

this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The limits of the following Place which is declared by order of the Local Authority for the burgh of Perth dated the twentieth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia (namely),—that part of the burgh of Perth bounded by Hospital-street on the north, King's-place on the south, King-street on the east, and St. Leonard-street on the west, the said bounding streets themselves being part of the Infected Place; and the whole of the South Inch of Perth, including both divisions thereof, and also including King's-place, Marshall-place, and the Shore-road between Princes-street and the Water-House, and that part of the Edinburgh-road between the south end of Princes-street and the General Prison; but excluding the Shore-road from the Water-House southwards,—are hereby contracted or altered so as only to include the Place as described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Place so described in the Schedule to this Order shall from and after the commencement of this Order be deemed to be the Place declared by the said order of the Local Authority to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twentieth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

SCHEDULE.

A Place comprising that part of the burgh of Perth bounded by Hospital-street on the north, King's-place on the south, King-street on the east, and St. Leonard-street on the west, the said bounding streets themselves being part of the Infected Place; and the whole of the South Inch of Perth, including both divisions thereof, and also including King's-place, Marshall-place, and the Shore-road between Princes-street and the Water-House; but excluding the Shore-road from the Water-House southwards, and also that part of the Edinburgh-road between the south end of Princes-street and the General Prison.
