AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 25th day of October, 1886.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

- 1. The following Place (namely),—at Durford Farm, in the parish of Rogate, in the Western Division of the county of Sussex, including all such lands, buildings, and premises as are situate within the following bounds, namely,—commencing at a point on the Petersfield and Midhurst Railway at the junction of the county of Sussex with the county of Southampton, along the boundary of the said counties to the Jolly Drovers Public-house on the London and Portsmouthroad (excluding the same road), thence along Drovers-road over Rogate Common and down the Broad-road to the bottom thereof (excluding the same roads), thence by the lane past Hale Common and the lane leading by Vicarage Farm into the Midhurst and Petersfield-road (exclusive of the same lanes), thence along the same last-mentioned road eastward to Rogate Village (including the same road), thence along Habin-lane over Habin Bridge (exclusive of the same lane), by Sandhill to the Railway Bridge, and thence along the said Railway westward as far as the said county of Sussex extends,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the tenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Place shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.
- 2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-sixth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

The following Area (namely),—in the Western Division of the county of Sussex and in the county of Southampton, comprised within the following boundary, that is to say, commencing at the Bridge crossing the Railway near Rogate Station, along the road leading to South Harting (exclusive of the same road) to North - end Cottage, thence by the road to the Greyhound Public-house, round by Torberry Hill and Little Torberry Hill (inclusive of the last-mentioned road) into the Harting and Petersfield-road, along the same road past Hurst Farm crossing the boundary of the county of Sussex with the county of Southampton and proceeding along the said road past Stanbridge Farm, and thence by Heathlane and Pulen-lane to Little-street at its junction with the London and Portsmouth-road, and thence along the said road to The Drovers Publichouse at Hill Brow (exclusive of the said roads), thence in a southerly direction along the boundary between the said counties of Sussex and Southampton to the Midhurst and Petersfield Railway, and thence along the said Railway to the Bridge aforesaid,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the ninth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuropneumonia.
- 2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-sixth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

Definition.

1. In this Warrant the expression "Parcel" means a Postal Packet which is posted as a Parcel, in accordance with the provisions of this Warrant, or any Warrant amending the same.

Places between which Parcels may be transmitted.

2. From and after the date when this Warrant comes into operation, Parcels may, subject to the provisions of this Warrant, be transmitted by Post by way of the United Kingdom and the several routes specified in the schedule hereto between the places mentioned in the first column of such schedule, and the countries mentioned in the second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth, and seventh columns respectively of such schedule.

Rates of Postage.

3. On all Parcels transmitted by Post under this Warrant from any place mentioned in the first column to any country mentioned in the second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth, or seventh column of the schedule hereto, there shall be charged and paid, according to the route of transmission and weight of such Parcels respectively, the several rates of postage specified in such schedule.

Maximum Dimensions and Weight.

4. No Parcel, the dimensions of which shall exceed in any direction two feet, or which in the case of Parcels posted in or addressed to Austro-Hungary, Denmark, Heligoland, Switzerland, Germany, or Sweden, shall exceed six pounds in weight, or in the case of Parcels posted in or addressed to Belgium, the Netherlands, or Norway shall exceed eleven pounds in weight, shall be conveyed or tendered for conveyance under this Warrant.

Mode of Posting.

- 5.
