(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 2nd day of November, 1886.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The limits of the following Area which is declared by Order of Council dated the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia (namely),— in the county of Southampton, comprised within the following boundary, that is to say, commencing at a point at the parish boundary between Froxfield and Privett at Fishers Copse in a north-easterly direction along the said parish boundary to the Basing Dean-road, thence along the said road to the foot of Tallywater Hill, proceeding thence along the Barnet Side-lane to its junction with Green-lane, thence along Green-lane in a north-westerly direction to the road leading to Alexanders farm, thence in a north or north-easterly direction along the said last-mentioned road to the main-road leading from the Trooper Inn to Edge Corner, thence along the said main-road to Edge Corner aforesaid, thence along the London and Gosport-road in the direction of Westmeon to The Jumps, thence along Fawley-lane till it joins Hempland-lane, thence along the said lane to Malthouse farm to its junction with the boundary line between the parishes of Froxfield and Privett aforesaid, and thence along the said boundary line to the point at Fishers Copse aforesaid: the said roads not being included in the Area,—are hereby extended so as to include the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the third day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

An Area in the county of Southampton, com-

prised within the following boundary, that is to say, commencing at a point at the parish boundary between Froxfield and Privett at Fishers Copse in a north-easterly direction along the said parish boundary to the Basing Dean-road, thence along the said road to the foot of Tallywater Hill, proceeding thence along the Barnet Side-lane to its junction with Green-lane, thence along Green-lane in a north-westerly direction to the road leading to Alexanders farm, thence in a north or north-easterly direction along the said last-mentioned road to the main-road leading from the Trooper Inn to Edge Corner, thence along the said main-road to Edge Corner aforesaid, thence along the London and Gosport-road in the direction of Westmeon to The Jumps, thence along Fawley-lane till it joins Hempland-lane, thence along the said lane to Malthouse farm to its junction with the boundary line between the parishes of Froxfield and Privett aforesaid, and thence along the said boundary line to the point at Fishers Copse aforesaid: the said roads (excepting the road called Barnet Side-lane) not being included in the Area.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board. Collectors of Poor Rates: Altering Districts and Appointment of Additional Collector: (Altering General Order):—

Wandsworth and Clapham Union.

Parish of Battersea.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Wandsworth and Clapham Union, in the county of Surrey;—

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Battersea, in the said Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by certain Orders dated respectively the 2nd day of April, 1836, the 8th day of April, 1848, the 17th day of July, 1863, the 23rd day of January, 1867, and the 15th day of July, 1879, the Poor Law Commissioners, the Poor Law Board, and the Local Government Board made provision with regard to the appointment and remuneration of Collectors of Poor Rates for the parish of Battersea, in the said Wandsworth and Clapham Union;

And whereas by the last-mentioned Order the said parish was divided into four Districts for the collection of the Poor Rates, to be termed respectively District No. 1, District No. 2, District No. 3, and District No. 4, such Districts respectively comprising all the property rateable to the Poor Rate within the boundaries of the several Wards numbered one, two, three, and four, formed under the Metropolis Local Management Act Amendment Act, 1862, as such boundaries are described by an Order of the Metropolitan Board of Works, dated the 21st day of February, 1873, and published in the London Gazette of the 29th day of April, 1873;

And whereas the Guardians of the Poor of the said Union have made application to Us, the Local Government Board, for the formation of an additional District, and Mr. George Nichols and Mr. Charles Shepherd, who hold the offices of Collector of the Poor Rates for the said District No. 2 and District No. 4 respectively, have consented to the alteration of their Districts accordingly:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows:

ARTICLE I.—The said parish of Battersea shall, for the purposes of the collection of the Poor Rates, be divided into five Districts, to be termed respectively District No. 1, District No. 2, District No. 3, District No. 4, and District No. 5.

ARTICLE II.—District No. 2 and District No. 4, as formed by the above-cited Order dated the 15th day of July, 1879, shall be altered, and an additional District shall be formed, to be termed District No. 5, which shall consist of so much of

District No. 2 as lies to the south of the main line of the London and South Western Railway Company, together with so much of District No. 4 as lies north of the Clapham-road.

ARTICLE III.—The Guardians of the Poor of the said Union shall, within one calendar month from the date hereof, appoint a fit and proper person as Collector of the Poor Rates for District No. 5.

ARTICLE IV.—The said Guardians shall pay to each of the persons for the time being appointed to or holding the office of Collector of the Poor Rates for each of the said Districts, under the authority of the above-cited Orders, or of this Order, for the performance of the duties of such office, such remuneration, by way of poundage or annual salary, as We may, with the consent of such person, from time to time direct or approve.

ARTICLE V.—Such remuneration shall be charged to the said parish, and, in the case of an annual salary, shall be considered as accruing from day to day, and be apportionable in respect of time accordingly, in pursuance of the provisions of "The Apportionment Act, 1870."

ARTICLE VI.—All the provisions contained in the first above-cited Order shall, subject to the provisions contained in this Order and in any other Order which may have been issued by the Poor Law Board and by Us respectively, or which may hereafter be issued by Us, applicable to such an appointment, apply to the additional Collector to be appointed under the authority of this Order.

ARTICLE VII.—The General Order dated the seventeenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, relative to Collectors of Poor Rates and Assistant-Overseers, shall apply as if this Order had been in force at the date of the issue of the said General Order.

ORDER of the Local Government Board. Amending "The Dairies, Cow-sheds, and Milk-shops Order of 1885":—

To the Mayor and Commonalty and Citizens of the City of London, acting by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of that City in Common Council assembled;—

To the Metropolitan Board of Works;—

To the several Urban and Rural Sanitary Authorities for the time being in England and Wales;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 34 of the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, (herein-after referred to as "the principal Act"), it was enacted that Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council (herein-after referred to as "the Privy Council") might from time to time make such general or special Orders as they should think fit, subject and according to the provisions of the Act, for the purposes specified in that Section;

And whereas on the 15th day of June, 1885, the Privy Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the principal Act, made a General Order known as "The Dairies, Cow-sheds, and Milk-shops Order of 1885," (herein-

after referred to as "the Order of 1885"); and such Order extends to the whole of England and Wales;

And whereas by Article 14 of the Order of 1885 it is provided that a copy of every Regulation therein referred to shall be sent to the Privy Council, and that if at any time the Privy Council are satisfied on inquiry with respect to any Regulation that the same is of too restrictive a character, or otherwise objectionable, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall not come into operation, or shall thereupon cease to operate, as the case may be;

And whereas by Section 9 of the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1886 (herein-after referred to as "the Act of 1886"), it is enacted as follows:—

"(1.) The powers vested in the Privy Council of making general or special Orders under Section thirty-four of the principal Act, for the purposes of that Section mentioned, are hereby transferred to and shall henceforth be exercisable by the Local Government Board; every such Order shall have effect as if enacted in this Section, and shall be published in such manner as the Local Government Board may direct, and the said Board may from time to time alter or revoke any such order."

"(2.) For the purposes of the said Section and this Section, and of any Order in force thereunder, the expression local authority, unless the context otherwise requires, in the Metropolis has the same meanings as in the principal Act, and elsewhere has the same meanings as in the Public Health Act, 1875."

* * * * *

"(5.) The like penalties for offences against orders or regulations made for the purposes of Section 34 of the principal Act as amended by this Section may be imposed by the Local Government Board or local authority making the same, and such offences may be prosecuted and penalties recovered in a summary manner, and subject to the like provisions, as if such orders or regulations were byelaws of a local authority under the Public Health Act, 1875, and as if the local authority mentioned in that Act included a local authority in the Metropolis as defined in this Section."

* * * * *

"6 (a). The Dairies, Cow-sheds, and Milk-shops Order of 1885, and any regulations thereunder, or having effect in pursuance thereof, made by any local authority under the principal Act, other than the local authority of a county, shall be deemed to have been made respectively by the Local Government Board and by a local authority under this Section."

And whereas it is expedient that the Order of 1885 should be altered as herein-after mentioned, and that penalties should be imposed for offences against such Order:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in Us by the Act of 1886, hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE 1.—This Order may be cited as "The Dairies, Cow-sheds, and Milk-shops Amending Order of 1886."

ARTICLE 2.—Article 14 of the Order of 1885 shall be altered by the substitution therein of the words "Local Government Board" for the words "Privy Council" occurring therein.

ARTICLE 3.—If any person is guilty of an offence against the Order of 1885, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty of Five Pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of Forty Shillings for each

day after written notice of the offence from the Local Authority.

Provided, nevertheless, that the Justices or Court before whom any complaint may be made, or any proceedings may be taken in respect of any such offence, may, if they think fit, adjudge the payment as a penalty of any sum less than the full amount of the penalty imposed by this Order.

ARTICLE 4.—In this Order the expression "Local Authority" means—

In the City of London and the Liberties thereof, the Mayor and Commonalty and Citizens of the City of London acting by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of that City in Common Council assembled :

In the Metropolis, except the City of London and the Liberties thereof, the Metropolitan Board of Works :

Elsewhere than in the Metropolis, the Urban or Rural Sanitary Authority.
