(Swine-Fever.)

A T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 3rd day of November, 1886.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—in the borough of Birmingham comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north the borough boundary from Lawley-street to Bordesley Green-road, on the south Glover's-road and Arthur-street, on the east Victoria-street, Muntz-street, Golden Hillock-road to Glover's-road, and on the west the borough boundary from Kingston-road to Watery-lane,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the twenty-third day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fourth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

#### (PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

A T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 5th day of November, 1886.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered,

1. The limits of the following Area which is declared by Order of Council to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia (namely),—in the county of Southampton, comprised within the following boundary, that is to say, commencing at a point at the parish boundary between Froxfield

and Privett at Fishers Copse in a northeasterly direction along the said parish boundary to the Basing Dean-road, thence along the said road to the foot of Tallywater Hill, proceeding thence along the Barnet Side-lane to its junction with Green-lane, thence along Greenlane in a north-westerly direction to the road leading to Alexanders farm, thence in a north or north-easterly direction along the said last-mentioned road to the main-road leading from the Trooper Inn to Edge Corner, thence along the said main-road to Edge Corner aforesaid, thence along the London and Gosport-road in the direction of Westmeon to The Jumps, thence along Fawley-lane till it joins Hempland-lane, thence along the said lane to Malthouse farm to its junction with the boundary line between the parishes of Froxfield and Privett aforesaid, and thence along the said boundary line to the point at Fishers Copse aforesaid: the said roads (excepting the road called Barnet Side-lane) not being included in the Area,—are hereby extended so as to include the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area

infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the sixth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

Where he executes The official receiver shall also be allowed all proper out of pocket expenses. any conveyance or transacts any legal or other business at the instance of third parties, the parties interested shall be required to pay for his time occupied and for that of his clerks according to such scale as the Board of Trade may from time to time prescribe, and to pay all legal or other necessary expenses incurred by him.

#### TABLE E.

For every order of administration under section 122, two shillings in the pound on the total amount of the debts scheduled from time to time, excluding any fraction of a pound in such total.

#### ORDER AS TO STAMPS.

ORDER as to the Fees and Per-Centages which are required to be taken for Bankruptcy Proceedings in the High Court of Justice and Court of Appeal by means of Stamps, amending the previous Order on the same subject, published in the Supplement to the London Gazette.

WHEREAS by section three of the Public Offices Fees Act, 1879, it is provided that the Treasury may from time to time make and when made, rovoke, alter, and add to, regulations for all or any of the following purposes respecting fees in any Public Office, that is to say :-

(1.) Regulating the manner in which the fees taken in money are to be taken, accounted for, and

(2.) Determining the use of impressed or adhesive stamps, and the mode of cancellation of adhesive stamps.

(3.) Regulating the use of stamps and prescribing the application thereof to documents from time to time in use, and requiring documents to be used for the purpose of such stamps.

Provided that so far as they relate to the office of any Court of Law, they shall be made with the consent of the Lord Chancellor.

Now we, the undersigned, being two of the Lords of Her Majesty's Treasury, do, with the concurrence of the Lord Chancellor, hereby give notice and order and direct:

That from and after the twenty-fifth day of October, 1886, in lieu of any regulations on the subject heretofore in force, the stamps used for denoting the fees and per-centages described in the schedule hereto subjoined shall, so far as they are payable in regard to proceedings in the High Court of Justice and Court of Appeal, be of the character and be applied and otherwise dealt with as prescribed by such schedule. And we do further enjoin that this Order shall be binding on all Courts, Officers, and persons whom such regulations may in any way affect.

The adhesive stamps herein referred to shall be of the description overprinted with the word "Bankruptcy," except where otherwise provided. They shall be cancelled by the various Court or other officials by perforation or in such manner as the Commissioners of Inland Revenue may from time to time direct. The impressed stamps also shall be of such character as the said Commissioners may adopt for the purpose.

The official forms with impressed or adhesive stamps (as the case may be) required in respect of any proceedings herein referred to may be obtained at the Inland Revenue Offices, Royal Courts of Justice. Persons may, however, in addition have their own forms stamped at that office or at the corresponding office at Somerset House.
