West Lulworth Water Works Undertaking.
(Notice of Intended Application for Provisional Order).

NOTICE is hereby given, in pursuance of "The Gas and Waterworks Facilities Act, 1870" (33 and 34 Vict., c. 70), and "The Gas and Waterworks Facilities Act, 1870, Amendment Act, 1873" (36 and 37 Vict., c. 89), that Reginald Joseph Weld, of Lulworth Castle, in the county of Dorset, Esq., acting by Thomas Joseph Weld Blundell, of Lulworth Castle aforesaid, Esq., the Committee of his estate (he being a person of unsound mind, so found by inquisition), by and with the leave and sanction of the Master in Lunacy, intends to apply to the Board of Trade for a Provisional Order, pursuant to the said statutes and the rules and regulations made thereunder, for the following purposes, viz. :—

- (a.) To empower the applicant to maintain and continue the waterworks, and works connected therewith, recently erected and made, or now in the course of being erected and made in West Lulworth aforesaid :

- (c.) To empower the applicant, from time to time, to alter and enlarge and renew the aforesaid waterworks and works connected therewith, and to erect and make, from time to time, such new and extended works as any increase in the demand for water or in the number of houses or buildings to be supplied may render necessary or expedient :
- (d.) To authorize the applicant to enter upon any houses, buildings, lands, and premises supplied by him for any purpose relative to or connected with such supply :
- (e.) To empower the applicant to make, demand, levy, and take in respect of water supplied by him under the authority of such Provisional Order, rents or rates respectively, not exceeding the sums to be specified in such Provisional Order, subject and according to the regulations therein specified :
- (f.) To incorporate in such Provisional Order the provisions of "The Waterworks Clauses Act, 1847," and of "The Waterworks Clauses Act, 1863."

The works consist of the reservoirs, water mains, valves, hydrants, cattle troughs, self-closing wall fountains, and the works in connection therewith, recently erected and in the course of erection by the aforesaid Reginald Joseph Weld, in the said parish of West Lulworth. The only new works proposed are such additions to or alterations in the above reservoirs, mains, and other works as may from time to time be or become necessary to meet any increase in the demand for water, or in the number of houses and buildings required to be supplied. Such new works (if any) will be made in the parish of and in the village of West Lulworth aforesaid.
