### By the QUEEN. A PROCLAMATION. VICTORIA, R.

W HEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to the eleventh day of November instant, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby issue Our Royal Proclamation, and publish and declare that the said Parliament be further prorogued to Thursday, the ninth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

> Given at Our Court at Windsor, this tenth day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and in the fiftieth year of Our reign.

> > GOD save the QUEEN.

#### PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**T** is this day ordered by Her Majesty in Council that the Convocations of the Provinces of Canterbury and York be prorogued from the day to which the same now stand prorogued to Friday, the tenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six; and the Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellor of that part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain is to cause Writs to be prepared and issued in the usual manner for proroguing the Convocations accordingly.
