NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 256.)—NORWAY—WEST COAST.
BREDSUND.

Light on Græsholmen.

THE Norwegian Government has given notice, that on 15th October, 1886, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse erected on Græsholmen, southern side of Bredsund:—

The light, of the fourth order, is visible in all directions except through an obscured arc of 15° , over Flörauden, or between the bearings of N. $73\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ W. and N. $58\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ W. It shows a fixed white light, except over the rocks and shoals in Bredsund, over which it is either quick flashing white or fixed red, as follows:—quick flashing white from S. $84\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ E. (so that the light is seen towards Rundö) to S. $67\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ E. (leading northward of Lillevaaren); fixed red over Golla, or from S. $51\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ E. to S. $44\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ E.; quick flashing white over Valleboen, or from S. $29\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ E. to S. $16\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ E.; and fixed red over Haaflue, or from S. $4\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ E. to S. $1\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ W.

The light is elevated 74 feet above the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 10 miles.

It will be exhibited annually from 1st August to 15th May.

Position, lat. $62^{\circ} 25' 45''$ N., long. $5^{\circ} 46' 00''$ E. [The bearings are magnetic, and are given from seaward. Variation $16\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ Westerly in 1886.]

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 257.)—BAL TIC.—SWEDISH COAST—
STOCKHOLM APPROACH.

(1.) *Harbour Light on Wicksten Rock.*

THE Swedish Government has given notice, that on 11th October, 1886, a harbour light was exhibited from the gable of a lighthouse erected on the north-west point of Wicksten Rock, southern entrance to Dalarö Channel, approach to Stockholm:—

The light is an alternating white and red light, visible in the fairways—to the southward towards Landsort, and to the northward towards Masknuf. It is elevated 36 feet above the sea, and should be seen in clear weather, the white light from a distance of 7 miles, the red light from a distance of 5 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric, or by reflectors.

The lighthouse is white in colour; a store, painted red, stands near it.

Position, lat. $58^{\circ} 47' 40''$ N., long. $17^{\circ} 57' 10''$ E. This light will be exhibited annually from 1st August to 15th December. It is not constantly attended to.
