

Third. That the vessel in which they are imported has not, within twenty-eight days before taking them on board, had on board any swine exported or carried coastwise from a port or place in Denmark or in Sweden.

Fourth. That the vessel has not within twenty-one days before taking them on board or at any time since taking on board the animals imported, entered any port or place in any country other than in Her Majesty's Possessions in North America, or in Norway, or in Iceland, or in New Zealand, or in the Channel Islands, or in the Isle of Man, or in Denmark, or in Sweden, or in the United States of America.

Fifth. That the animals imported have not, while on board the vessel, been in contact with any animal exported or carried coastwise from any port or place in any country other than in Her Majesty's Possessions in North America, or in Norway, or in Iceland, or in New Zealand, or in the Channel Islands, or in the Isle of Man, or (subject to the sixth condition of this Article) in Denmark or in Sweden.

Sixth. That the animals imported have not, while on board the vessel, been in contact with any swine exported or carried coastwise from a port or place in Denmark or in Sweden.

(2.) And the animals imported shall not be landed at a Landing-Place for foreign animals unless and until—

(a.) The owner or charterer of the vessel in which they are imported, or his agent in England or Wales or Scotland, has entered into a bond to Her Majesty the Queen, in a sum not exceeding one thousand pounds, with or without a surety or sureties, to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Customs, conditioned for the observance of the foregoing conditions; and

(b.) The master of the vessel has on each occasion of importation of foreign animals therein satisfied the Commissioners of Customs, or their proper officer, by declaration made and signed or otherwise, that all the animals then imported therein are properly imported according to the provisions of this Article.

Interpretation.

3. In this Order terms have the same meaning as in The Animals Order of 1886.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as THE ANIMALS (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1886.

Commencement.

5. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the twenty-fourth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

(SWINE-FEVER.)

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—the Petty

Sessional Division of Miskin Lower, in the county of Glamorgan,—which was declared by Order of Council to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twentieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Telegram, dated 14th instant, from Her Majesty's Representative at Constantinople, stating:—"Quarantine on departures from Danube and Black Sea ports from Sulina to Bourgas, and from the Adriatic coast, Italy, Austria-Hungary, and Montenegro, as well as on arrivals from the Province of Malaga, is reduced from ten to five days, to be undergone, as before, in one of the Ottoman ports. Ten days' quarantine is maintained against departures from Genoa and from the coast of Italy, from the French frontier to Cape Santa Maria de Leuca inclusive, for the present. Departures from Sardinia are admitted to free pratique after medical inspection."
