And to all others whom it may concern.

HEREAS the population of the said parish of Hove, according to the last Census, exceeds two thousand persons;

And whereas at a Meeting of the Vestry of the said parish, held, pursuant to public notice in that behalf, on Thursday, the 17th day of June, 1886, it was resolved,

"That the Local Government Board be re-"quested to issue an Order, directing that "the Act passed on the 5th August, 1850 "(18 and 14 Vict., c. 57), entitled 'An "Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or "' other Meetings in Churches, and for re-"' gulating the Appointment of Vestry "Cierks, shall be applied to and put in " force within the Parish of Hove, so far as " such Act relates to the appointment of a " Vestry Clerk."

"That the duties to be assigned to such " Vestry Clerk be those specified in the 7th "Section of the Vestry Act, so far as the "same are not performed by the Assistant Overseer under the Order of the Poor "Law Commissioners dated the "September, 1838. The salary of such

"Vestry Clerk not to exceed £20 a year." And whereas the Churchwardens of the said parish have made application in writing to us, the Local Government Board, pursuant to the above Resolution:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to us by the Statutes in that behalf, we hereby order as follows:-
