

Vestry Clerk, shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said parish of Hove, and the provisions contained in Articles II, III, and IV of this Order shall apply to the Vestry Clerk for the time being appointed for that parish.

ARTICLE II.—The duties to be performed by the Vestry Clerk for the time being appointed under the provisions of the above-mentioned Act and of this Order shall be those mentioned in section 7 of that Act, except such of them as are assigned to the Assistant Overseer appointed for the said parish under the authority of the Order of the Poor Law Commissioners dated the twenty-fifth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight.

ARTICLE III.—The Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said parish shall pay to the Vestry Clerk a salary at the rate of twenty pounds per annum, or such other remuneration for the performance of the duties of that office as we may, with the consent of such person, from time to time direct.

ARTICLE IV.—Such remuneration, in the case of an annual salary, shall be considered as accruing from day to day, and be apportionable in respect of time accordingly, in pursuance of the provisions of "The Apportionment Act, 1870," and shall be paid quarterly on the usual quarter days in each year, namely, Michaelmas Day, Christmas Day, Lady Day, and Midsummer Day.

ARTICLE V.—A copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette by the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said parish.
