

the manufacture of gas, and to convert or utilize such residual products, and to store gas, residual and other products arising from the manufacture of gas thereon.

The lands to be so held and used for the manufacture and storage of gas, and for gas works, and for the manufacture and storage of residual products arising from the manufacture of gas, or of the materials used therein, and for other the purposes of the Bill, are—

First. The lands now belonging to or held by or in trust for the original Company, and on parts of which the gas works of that Company have been erected, that is to say:—

A parcel of land, containing one acre or thereabouts, situate in the parish of Basingstoke, in the county of Southampton, and bounded on the east partly by land belonging, or reputed to belong, to the Right Honourable William Henry Lord Bolton, or his trustees, and partly by land and buildings belonging to the Basingstoke Urban Sanitary Authority, on the west partly by messuages and land belonging or reputed to belong to Messieurs J. May and Company, partly by messuages and land belonging or reputed to belong to Francis Charles Simpson and Robert Neville, partly by land belonging, or reputed to belong to the trustees of the will of George Lamb, deceased, and partly by an approach road leading from the Gas Works Road to the existing works of the original Company, on the north partly by land belonging or reputed to belong to the said William Henry Lord Bolton or his trustees, partly by a messuage and land belonging or reputed to belong to John Charles Pitman Curtis, and partly by the said approach road leading from the Gas Works Road, and on the south partly by land belonging or reputed to belong to the Basingstoke Urban Sanitary Authority, and partly by the said messuages and land belonging or reputed to belong to Messieurs J. May and Company, and partly by the public road from Basingstoke to Basing.

2ndly. A parcel of land situate in the said parish of Basingstoke, in the county of Southampton, comprising one acre or thereabouts, being part of an arable field numbered on the 25-inch ordnance map of the county of Southampton 111, in the parish of Basingstoke, belonging or reputed to belong to the said William Henry Lord Bolton, or his Trustees, and occupied by Henry Portsmouth, and lying on the east and north sides of and adjoining the land and works of the original Company, and bounded on the east and north by other parts of the said arable field, on the west partly by the said lands and works of the original Company, partly by messuages and land belonging or reputed to belong to John Charles Pitman Curtis, and partly by a messuage and land belonging or reputed to belong to the representatives of Samuel Chandler, deceased, and on the south partly by the lands and works of the original Company, and partly by other parts of the said arable field.

3rdly. A parcel of land situate in the parish of Eastrop, in the county of Southampton, belonging or reputed to belong to the Trustees of the Will of George Lamb, deceased, and occupied by George Hunt, and containing 49 poles or thereabouts, and bounded on the east by the land and works of the original Company, on the west by Gas Works Road, on the north by the before-mentioned approach road leading from the Gas Works

Road to the works of the original Company, and on the south by messuages and land belonging or reputed to belong to Francis Charles Simpson and Robert Neville.

To enable the Company to purchase and acquire by agreement or by compulsion, if necessary, for the purposes of their Undertaking, the lands and other property secondly and thirdly hereinbefore described, and upon the lands first, secondly, and thirdly hereinbefore described, or any part or parts thereof, to erect, make, and maintain additional buildings, works, and conveniences for the manufacture and storage of gas and the residual products arising therefrom, and also to manufacture and store gas thereon.

To purchase or take on lease, or otherwise acquire, by agreement, and to hold other lands, houses, and hereditaments, for purposes other than the manufacture or storage of gas within the limits of supply, or to acquire easements or rights over or under any such lands and hereditaments, and to sell, lease, or otherwise dispose of any lands, works, and property from time to time vested in or purchased by the Company, or to exchange any such land.

To deal in, sell, and dispose of coal, lime, coke, tar, asphalt, chemicals, and other residual and manufactured products, and other matters and things, and to carry on the business usually carried on by Gas Companies.

To supply gas in bulk, or otherwise, for purposes of light, heat, or motive power, and for cooking food, and for any other purpose for which gas is suitable, to levy rates, rents, and charges for the supply of gas, and to exercise all or any of the rights and powers now enjoyed or exercised by the original Company with respect to the supply of gas, and also all such other rights, powers, and privileges as may be conferred by the Bill.

To enable the Company on the one hand, and any Local Authority, Company, Corporation, public body, officers, or persons on the other hand, to enter into and carry into effect contracts, agreements, and arrangements for or with respect to the supply by the Company to any such Local Authority, Company, Corporation or public body, officers or persons, of gas in bulk or otherwise for any public, trading or other purposes; and to authorise any such Local Authority, Corporation, Company, public body, officers or persons respectively to apply their respective funds, and to raise further moneys for the purposes of any such contract, agreement or arrangement; and to sanction and confirm any such contract, agreement or arrangement already made, or which prior to the passing of the Bill may be made with respect to the matters aforesaid.

To enable the Company to acquire, hold, use, and enjoy patent rights, licenses, and authorities under letters patent in relation to the manufacture, conversion, distribution, and utilization of gas, and the residual products arising therefrom within the limits of supply, and to carry on the business usually carried on by Gas Companies, or which is or may become incidental thereto.

To maintain, alter, or renew any existing gas works, mains, and pipes within the limits of supply, and to lay down and maintain, alter, or renew mains and pipes or other apparatus, in, through, across, along, or under lands, streets, roads, public or private lanes, railways, rivers, canals, waters, sewers, drains, pipes, bridges, and other passages and places within the limits of supply.

To empower the Company to manufacture and purchase or hire gas meters, stoves, fittings, or other apparatus, and to sell, fit up, or let the
