10 miles 12 chains or thereabouts.

(6) A railway wholly in the parish of Carisbrook, commencing by a junction with the authorized railway at the distance thereon of 12 miles 10 chains or thereabouts, and terminating at a point thereon by a junction with the Cowes and Newport Railway, 10 chains or thereabouts from the southernmost corner of the passenger station buildings of the Newport station on that railway.
