

the previous twelve calendar months complied with the conditions as to residence which for the time being are required by law and that both of such yearly payments shall be apportionable between any archdeacon resigning or otherwise avoiding the said archdeaconry or his representatives (as the case may be) and the archdeacon who shall next be collated to the same archdeaconry.

"Provided always and we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners with the like consent of the said William Archbishop of York (testified as aforesaid) and also with the consent of the Venerable Richard Frederick Lefevre Blunt the present Archdeacon of the said Archdeaconry of the East Riding of York (testified by his having signed and sealed this scheme) further recommend and propose that the said annual payment of eleven pounds hereinbefore recommend to be made to the archdeacon for the time being of the said archdeaconry shall be and be taken to be in lieu of and in full substitution for the payment amounting to thirteen shillings and four pence per annum now payable by us the said Commissioners to the archdeacon for the time being of the said archdeaconry in respect of procurations as aforesaid and that the said lastly mentioned payment shall accordingly determine and cease to be so payable as from the first day of January in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of York.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the sixteenth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty,

chapter fifty-five have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint John the Evangelist situate at Clifton in the parish or parochial chapelry of Hartshead-cum-Clifton within the original limits of the parish of Dewsbury in the county of York and in the diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint John the Evangelist situate at Clifton as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend William Boyd Bishop of the said diocese of Ripon (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion be expedient that all that part of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Hartshead-cum-Clifton which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint John the Evangelist situate at Clifton as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist, Clifton.'

"And with the like consent of the said William Boyd Bishop of the said diocese of Ripon (testified as aforesaid) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages baptisms churchings and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint John the Evangelist situate at Clifton as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being. Provided always that so long as the Reverend Thomas King, Clerk in Holy Orders, the present vicar or incumbent of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Hartshead-cum-Clifton aforesaid shall continue to be such vicar or incumbent all the fees which may be received in respect of such publication solemnization or performance at the said church of Saint John the Evangelist situate at Clifton as aforesaid shall be paid over by the minister thereof to the said Thomas King; and provided also that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We therefore humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist, Clifton being:—

"All that part of the parish or parochial chapelry of Hartshead-cum-Clifton, within the original limits of the parish of Dewsbury in the county of York and in the diocese of Ripon which is bounded upon the south by the chapelry district of Christ Church Woodhouse upon the south-west by the district chapelry of Saint Matthew Rastrick upon the west by the new parish of Saint Martin Brighouse all in the county and
