Her Majesty's Most Gracious Speech, delivered by the Lords Commissioners, to both Houses of Parliament on Thursday, January 27, 1887.

My Lords and Gentlemen,

MY relations with all Foreign Powers continue to be friendly.

The affairs of South-Eastern Europe are still in an unsettled condition; but I do not apprehend that any disturbance of European peace will result from the unadjusted controversies which have arisen in that region. While deploring the events which compelled Prince Alexander of Bulgaria to retire from the Government of that Principality, I have not judged it expedient to interfere in the proceedings for the election of his successor until they arrive at that stage at which my assent is required by the stipulations of the Treaty of Berlin.

The task which has been undertaken by my Government in Egypt is not yet accomplished; but substantial advance has been made towards the assurance of external and internal tranquillity.

In Burmah operations have been conducted by my troops with bravery and skill for the purpose of extirpating the brigandage which has grown up during recent years of misgovernment. The bands of marauders by whom Upper Burmah has been long infested have been dispersed, and many of the leaders have laid down their arms. I entertain a confident hope that the general pacification of the country will be effected during the present season.

Commercial Treaties have been concluded with the Kingdoms of Greece and Roumania.

Papers on these subjects will be laid before you.

Gentlemen of the House of Commons,

The Estimates for the coming year will be submitted to you. They have been framed with a careful regard to economy, and to the efficiency of the public service.

My Lords and Gentlemen,

The condition of Ireland still requires your anxious attention. Grave crimes have happily been rarer during the last few months than during a similar period in the preceding year. But the relations between the owners and occupiers of land, which in the early part of the autumn exhibited signs of improvement, have since been seriously disturbed in some districts by organized attempts to incite the latter class to combine against the fulfilment of their legal obligations.

The efforts of my Government to cope with this evil have been seriously impeded by difficulties incident to the method at present prescribed by Statute for dealing with such offences. Your early attention will be called to proposals for reforms in legal procedure which seem necessary to secure the prompt and efficient administration of the criminal law.

Since I last addressed you, the Commissioners directed to inquire into certain subjects of great importance to the material welfare of Ireland have been actively prosecuting their labours. The Report of the Commission on the operation of the recent Acts dealing with the tenure and purchase of land will be shortly laid before you, and will doubtless receive from you the early and careful attention which the serious importance of the subject demands.

Bills for the improvement of Local Government in England and Scotland will be laid before you; and, should circumstances render it possible, they will be followed by a measure dealing with the same subject in Ireland.

A Bill for improving and cheapening the process of Private Bill legislation in England, Scotland, and Ireland will be submitted to you.

You will be asked to consider measures having for their object to remove hindrances which exist to the cheap and rapid Transfer of Land, to facilitate the provision of Allotments for Small Householders, and to provide for the readier Sale of Glebe Lands.

The Commission which I issued in 1885 to inquire into the lamentable depression under which Trade and Agriculture have been suffering for many years has presented a valuable Report, which, together with the important evidence collected by them, will be laid before you.

A Bill for altering the mode of levying Tithes in England and Wales will be submitted to you.

In regard to Scotland, you will be asked to consider measures for the reform of the Universities for completing recent legislation as to the powers of the Secretary for Scotland, and for amending the procedure of Criminal Courts.

Measures dealing with the regulation of Railway rates, and for preventing the fraudulent use of Merchandise marks, will also be brought under your consideration.

In the performance of these and all your other momentous duties, I earnestly pray that the blessing of Almighty God may attend your labours.

And whereas the Coleraine Harbour Com-
missioners, being the Pilotage Authority for the
Port and Harbour of Coleraine within the meaning
of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," in
exercise of the powers vested in them by that
Act, have made and submitted for the consent
of Her Majesty certain Bye-laws and Regulations:

And whereas it has been made to appear to
Her Majesty that the proposed Bye-laws and
Regulations are reasonable and proper:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the
powers vested in Her by the said "Merchant
Shipping Act, 1854," and by and with the advice
of Her Privy Council, is pleased to approve of
and signify Her consent to the said Bye-laws and
Regulations, as set forth in the schedule hereto
annexed.

SCHEDULE.

1. Every Pilot shall immediately after leaving
any vessel which may have suffered any injury
whilst under his charge report the same to the
Superintendent of Pilots and shall likewise report
all accidents that may have taken place during
said time to such vessel, or to any other vessel,
caused in any manner by the vessel he was in
charge of, and in default of his making such
reports he shall be liable to a penalty not exceed-
ing two pounds or to suspension.

2. The Superintendent of Pilots shall inform
the Harbour Authority in writing of such reports
as to accidents as he may receive from time to
time from the Pilots or of such accidents as may
occur when he is personally in charge of the
Pilotage of vessels. Penalty not exceeding five
pounds for neglect or omission to comply with this
Bye-law.

3. Every Pilot shall obey the directions of the
Harbour Master as to the berthing or docking of
vessels under his charge and in case of neglect or
refusal so to do shall be liable to a penalty not
exceeding five pounds or to suspension or
dismissal.

4. Every Pilot ordered to an outward bound
vessel shall repair on board in sufficient time
before such vessel shall leave the Harbour and in
default of so doing shall be liable to a penalty
not exceeding two pounds or to suspension or
dismissal.

5. Every Pilot ordered to an inward bound
vessel shall repair with convenient despatch to
the entrance of the river or wherever directed by
the Superintendent of Pilots and make such
arrangement as may be most suitable under the
circumstances for boarding vessels lying in the
bay and in default of so doing he shall be liable
to a penalty of two pounds or to suspension or
dismissal.

6. Every Pilot shall behave himself with strict
sobriety and in case of intoxication, improper
conduct or language by such Pilot, such Pilot shall
be liable to a penalty of two pounds or to sus-
pension or dismissal.

7. Every Pilot on observing any alteration in
the buoys or beacons or any impediment in the
channel of the River shall immediately report the
same to the Superintendent of Pilots and in
default of his so doing shall be liable to a penalty
not exceeding two pounds, or to suspension.

8. No Master or mate to whom has been
granted a Pilotage Certificate for the Coleraine
Pilotage District under the Merchant Shipping
Act shall add to or in anywise alter such Certifi-
cate or make or alter any endorsement thereon or
at any time lend such Certificate or authorize any
person to act under the same.

Any person violating this Bye-law shall be

liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds or to suspension or withdrawal of his Certificate.

9. The limits to which the powers of the Commissioners in respect of Pilotage shall extend and which shall be called the Coleraine Pilotage District shall be:—From the quays at the town of Coleraine to an imaginary boundary line at sea formed by the part circumference of a circle drawn with a radius of one mile and with the seaward point of the east pier as centre.

10. The Commissioners may from time to time license and appoint during pleasure such number of Pilots to take charge of vessels coming into and going out of the Port and Harbour of Coleraine as they think expedient and the Commissioners may appoint in like manner a Superintendent of Pilots to control and direct the several Pilots to be appointed as aforesaid.

11. The Master of every vessel coming to or going from the Port and Harbour of Coleraine shall within the Coleraine Pilotage District employ to pilot his vessel a Pilot licensed and appointed by the Commissioners except in case of vessels exempted by Section 91 of the River Bann Navigation Act and in case of vessels engaging the services of the steam tug plying in the river. In these latter cases the Pilotage to be optional.

Pilotage Rates.

For piloting vessels from the northward limits of the Coleraine Pilotage District to the quays at the town of Coleraine, 1s. 6d. per foot draught.

For piloting vessels from the quays at the town of Coleraine to the northward limits of the Coleraine Pilotage District, 9d. per foot draught.

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that the said additional Bye-law is reasonable and proper:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the

power vested in Her by the said "Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to approve of and signify Her consent to the said additional Bye-law of the said Pilot Commissioners as set forth in the Schedule hereto annexed. *C. L. Peel.*

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five; and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Her Majesty, chapter eighty-two; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the sixteenth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, in the words following; that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Your Majesty chapter seventy of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-seven of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter fifty-five and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Your Majesty chapter eighty-two have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Michael and All Angels situate at Walthamstow within the limits of the parish of Walthamstow in the county of Essex and in the diocese of Saint Albans.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Walthamstow and of the new parish of Saint James Walthamstow in the county of Essex and diocese of Saint Albans aforesaid which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the schedule hereunder written there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such parish and new parish respectively.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said parish of Walthamstow and of the said new parish of

Saint James Walthamstow should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Michael and All Angels situate at Walthamstow as aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Thomas Legh Bishop of the said diocese of Saint Albans as such Bishop and also as the patron in right of his See of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint James Walthamstow and with the consents of the Reverend William Carus of Merton Bournemouth in the county of Hants late a canon residentiary of the Cathedral Church of Winchester of the Reverend William Cadman rector or incumbent of the rectory of the parish of the Holy Trinity Marylebone in the county of Middlesex canon of the Cathedral Church of Canterbury of the Reverend George Edward Tate vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the new parish of Saint Mary Kippington in the county of Kent, of the Reverend Field Flowers Goe rector or incumbent of the rectory of the parish of Saint George Bloomsbury in the said county of Middlesex, and of the Very Reverend Robert Payne Smith Doctor in Divinity Dean of the Cathedral Church of Canterbury aforesaid, the patrons of the vicarage of the said parish of Walthamstow (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish of Walthamstow and of the said new parish of Saint James Walthamstow which are described in the schedule hereunder written all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Michael and All Angels situate at Walthamstow as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Michael and All Angels, Walthamstow.'

"We therefore humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet."

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Michael and All Angels Walthamstow being:—

"All those several contiguous portions of the parish of Walthamstow and of the new parish of Saint James Walthamstow both in the county of Essex and in the diocese of Saint Albans which said portions of such cures are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint James Walthamstow from the parish of Walthamstow aforesaid at the point where High-street is joined by Palmerston-road and extending thence northward along the middle of the said road for a distance of thirty chains or thereabouts to a point upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Walthamstow from the new parish of Saint John Walthamstow in the county and diocese aforesaid and extending thence south-westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of twenty-two chains or thereabouts to the point at or near to the junction of the road called or known as Pretoria-avenue with Cross-street where the said last-mentioned boundary joins the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint John Walthamstow from the new

parish of Saint James Walthamstow aforesaid and extending thence first north-westward then south-westward and then again north-westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of sixty-six and a half chains or thereabouts thereby first following the middle of Pretoria-avenue aforesaid then following the middle of Clay-street and then following the middle of Ferry-lane to the point at Ferry Bridge at Hellier's Ferry on the River Lea where the said last-mentioned boundary joins the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint James Walthamstow from the new parish of the Holy Trinity Tottenham in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London and extending then first south-westward then southward and then generally south-eastward along the county and diocesan boundary for a distance of one mile and sixty-six chains or thereabouts thereby following the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint James Walthamstow from the new parish of the Holy Trinity Tottenham aforesaid from the new parish of Saint Ann Hanger-lane from the new parish of Saint Thomas Stamford Hill and from the new parish of Saint Matthew Upper Clapton (the three last-named cures being in the said county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London aforesaid) to the centre of the bridge known as the River Lea Bridge which carries the line of the Chingford and Walthamstow Branch of the Great Eastern Railway over the River Lea aforesaid and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said branch line of railway for a distance of one mile and thirty-nine chains or thereabouts to a point upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint James Walthamstow from the parish of Walthamstow aforesaid, and extending thence first northward and then south-westward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of five and a half chains or thereabouts thereby following in one part the course of Willow-walk and in another part the course of High-street aforesaid to the first-described point at the junction of the last-named street with Palmerston-road aforesaid where the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Saint Albans.
