HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the twenty-fourth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council dated the fourth day of February one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine (Regulations and Instructions for the Government of Your Majesty's Naval Service), and the twenty-sixth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six,

payment of money allowances from the funds of Greenwich Hospital has been authorized in the case of naval pensioners who are permanent inmates of naval hospitals or infirmaries, and whereas we consider it desirable to extend such benefits to pensioners who are admitted to hospitals or infirmaries for treatment only.

"We humbly beg to recommend that Your Majesty may be pleased to authorize that for the future pensioners admitted for treatment shall receive allowances on the same scale and under the same conditions as already authorized for pensioners who are permanent inmates, provided that such allowances shall not be paid concurrently with the pensioner's naval or other pension.

"And whereas by the fourth section of an Act passed in the thirty-third year of Your Majesty's reign, chapter forty-four entitled 'The Greenwich Hospital Act 1869,' it is enacted that the Admiralty may, under regulations to be from time to time made by them, admit any non-commissioned officers and men of the Royal Navy and Marines entitled to the benefits of Greenwich Hospital to a naval hospital or infirmary to be there maintained at the expense of Greenwich Hospital.

"We beg leave to submit that Your Majesty may be pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction that payment be made from the funds of Greenwich Hospital for each non-commissioned officer or man so maintained, as follows:—

"In naval hospitals or infirmaries... 2s. 6d. a day.

"In the Seamen's Hospital Society, Greenwich (as provided for in their lease of the infirmary of

Greenwich Hospital) 3s. a day.

"The above rates to take effect from the first
day of October, one thousand eight hundred and
sixty-nine.

"And whereas by the twentieth section of an Act passed in the twenty-ninth year of Your Majesty's reign, chapter eighty-nine, entitled 'The Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865,' it is amongst other things enacted that the Admiralty may (subject to the approval of Your Majesty in Council), fix the salaries of officers appointed for the service of Greenwich Hospital.

"And whereas by the eighth section of an Act passed in the thirty-sixth year of Your Majesty's reign entitled 'The Greenwich Hospital Act, 1872,' it is enacted that 'the provisions of the twentieth section of 'The Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865,' as far as the same relate to salaries shall extend to pensions and pecuniary benefits of any kind.'"

"And whereas we have deemed it expedient to abolish the office of Superintendent of the Greenwich Hospital Branch at the Admiralty, the retirement of the officer holding that appointment taking effect from the seventeenth August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

"We beg leave to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased to authorize the grant to such officer of a pension at the rate of £566 13s. 4d. per annum to take effect from the date of retirement, and a gratuity of £1,500."

Her Majesty having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the three hundred and thirtythird section of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for every Pilotage Authority by Bye-law made with the consent of Her Majesty in Council from time to time to do within its districts all or any of the things specified in that behalf in the said

And whereas Randolph Gordon Erskine Wemyss, Esquire, being the Pilotage Authority for the Port and Harbour of Leven and the Harbour of Methil within the meaning of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," has, in exercise of the powers vested in him by that Act and by "The Leven Harbour Act, 1876," and "The Methil Harbour Order, 1883," made and submitted for the consent of Her Majesty certain Bye-laws and Regulations:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that the proposed Bye-laws and

Regulations are proper and reasonable:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said Merchant Shipping Act, 1854, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council is pleased to approve of, and signify Her consent to, the said Byc-laws and Regulations as set forth in the Schedule hereto annexed. SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Order refers.

Pilotage Regulations.

I. Mr. R. Erskine Wemyss being the Pilotage Authority within the limits of the Port and Harbour of Leven, as defined by the "Leven Harbour Act, 1876," and within the limits of Methil Harbour, as defined by the "Methil Harbour Order, 1883," appoints the following enactments and regulations to be strictly enforced within the limits of the Pilotage Authority; and all Pilots licensed as hereinafter provided for, shall be subject to these and such other Bye-laws and Regulations as may be from time to time appointed, and also the provisions of that portion of the "Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," which relates to the Pilotage in so far as incumbent on

II. The limits of the Pilotage Authority under the above-named Act and Order shall be the Port and Harbour of Leven, and Harbour of Methil, and shall include that portion of the Firth of Forth bounded by an imaginary line drawn one

thousand yards due south, from the point at which the boundary between the parishes of Scoonie and Largo is intersected by high-water mark of ordinary spring tides, thence westward in an oblique line, until it meets the southernmost point of an imaginary radius line six hundred yards from the southernmost point of the pier or breakwater, authorized by the said "Methil Harbour Order, 1883," and thence along the said radius line to the westmost point thereof.

III. No Ship-Master shall be bound to employ

a Pilot either inward or outward.

IV. No person shall pilot or take charge of any vessel as Pilot within said limits without a License from Mr. R. Erskine Wemyss or his Factor, unless in the exceptional circumstances specified in the three hundred and sixty-second section of the "Merchant Shipping Act. 1854," An unlicensed person assuming or continuing in the charge of any ship after a licensed Pilot has offered to take charge of her, or using a license which he is not entitled to use, for the purpose of making himself appear to be a qualified Pilot, shall for each offence incur a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds.

V. Every person desirous of being licensed, shall lodge with Mr. Erskine Wemyss or his Factor, an application in his own hand-writing, setting forth his usual place of abode, his age, height, complexion, and any other circumstances or peculiarity descriptive of his person, and his employment during the three years preceding, and he shall also produce satisfactory certificates of

character.

VI. Mr. Erskine Wemyss shall examine and inquire into the skill, ability, and character of any person who shall offer himself to be admitted as a Pilot for the harbours, and within the Pilotage limits, by such ways and means as to him shall seem proper, and if upon such inquiry the person so offering himself as a Pilot shall be approved of, a license may be granted, certifying that such person is duly qualified to act as Pilot within the Pilotage limits, which license shall be subscribed by the Factor, provided always that no person shall be appointed Pilot of the said limits unless he shall at least have been three years regularly engaged as fisherman or sailor at or frequenting the said harbours; and Mr. Erskine Wemyss, by granting such license or certificate to any Pilot, shall not be responsible for any accident, damage, or loss sustained, by any vessel, cargo, or person, by or through the inadvertence, negligence, or wilful act of the Pilot so licensed by him, provided that nothing herein contained shall exempt the harbours from the provisions of any existing or future general Act of Parliament relating to

VII. Every person shall, on his first admission as a Pilot, pay for his first license the sum of 10s. 6d. (ten shillings and sixpence), and for every renewal of the said license, 5s. (five shillings). Every license must be renewed annually, but may

be recalled as aftermentioned.

VIII. Masters and Mates of vessels may be licensed by Mr. Erskine Wemyss or his Factor, in terms of sections three hundred and forty and three hundred and forty-one of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854." The fees paid by the said Masters and Mates shall be ten shillings and sixpence each upon the granting of certificates, and five shillings upon each renewal thereof, and these fees shall be applied to cover the general expenses connected therewith.

IX. The rates for Pilotage services shall be those specified in the table annexed hereto, and must be paid to the Collector of Dues at the harbour, and to no other person. These rates shall be paid over to the Licensed Pilots by the Collector of Dues, subject to deduction of five per cent. to cover expenses of collection.

X. Any qualified Pilot demanding or receiving, and also any Master offering or paying to any Pilot any other rate in respect to Pilotage services, whether greater or less than the rate for the time being demandable by law, shall for each offence incur a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

XI. The Pilots are required to make themselves thoroughly acquainted with the signals of the harbour, the Bye-laws and Regulations thereof, also with the harbour itself, the berths therein, the channel and fair-way thereof, the flow and ebb of the tides, and every other circumstance connected therewith, essential for the due performance of their duties with safety and despatch. They must implicitly obey the directions of the Harbour-Master, who will have power to see that all the Pilots execute their duties efficiently, and to report to the Factor all failures on their part to do so, and all breaches of these regulations.

XII. Every Pilot shall have a sufficient boat properly found to the satisfaction of Mr. Erskine Wemyss and his Harbour-Master. Every Pilot boat must be distinguished by the characteristics stated in the three hundred and forty-sixth section of "The Mershant Shipping Agt, 1854"

of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854."

XIII. The Pilots must always be readiness with their boats fully found and manned, to take charge of any vessel when required. They shall attend exclusively to the vessel under their charge, until she is berthed, if entering inwards, and so long as their services are required. No Pilot shall leave the vessel under his charge to assist other vessels, except with the consent of the Master, given in cases of great necessity and extreme danger.

XIV. Harbour Pilots, unless they are also Firth Pilots, shall not proceed in search of, or board vessels outwith the limits, as defined in Article I.

hereof.

XV. All Pilots must observe strict sobriety and civility in discharge of their duties, and when a Pilot shall fail to observe or commit any breach of the Regulations, or shall discharge his duties insufficiently, or shall use improper language to any of the Harbour Officials while in discharge of their duties, or shall refuse to take the charge of any vessel upon a proper signal being made, or a gun fired by any vessel inward bound, or upon the application of the Master, Owner, or Agent of any vessel outward bound, or shall fail to attend before Mr. Erskine Wemyss or his Factor, to answer for any misconduct, such an offender shall be punished by temporary suspension or permanent deprivation of license, or by the infliction of a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds, recoverable in terms of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854." Mr. Erskine Wemyss will also enforce the provisions of the three hundred and sixty-fifth, three hundred and sixty-sixth, and three hundred and sixty-seventh sections of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," against any Pilot committing any of the offences therein mentioned. Persons having cause of complaint against any Pilot, are requested to communicate the same, in writing, to the Factor or Harbour-Master.

XVI. The Master of all vessels desiring the services of a Harbour Pilot shall display and keep flying the usual signal for a Pilot, and shall, by all means consistent with safety, facilitate the getting on board of the first duly qualified Pilot who arrives at his vessel in answer to said signal.

XVII. The Master of every vessel employing a Pilot, shall sign and deliver, if so requested, to

the Pilot in charge of his vessel, a certificate, stating the registered tonnage and draught of water of his vessel. In case of refusal, or making a false declaration, the Master shall incur a penalty for every such offence not exceeding double the amount of Pilotage.

XVIII. Vessels bound for the Harbour, must, if necessary, heave to in the roads until a Harbour Pilot is obtained, and vessels waiting for the tide, shall be so placed as to be ready to come in immediately on the proper signal being given.

XIX. Vessels not entering the Harbour, but merely passing through the Pilotage limits, shall not be bound to employ a Harbour Pilot. If a vessel bound to Leven or Methil for orders is brought to anchor within the Harbour limits by a Firth Pilot—not licensed as a Harbour Pilot—such Pilot shall be entitled to stay by such ship until orders are obtained when, if such ship is to proceed to another port, he shall be entitled to take her away; but if she receive orders to unload, or enter the Harbour, he shall cease to act as Pilot, and the Pilotage shall be undertaken by a Harbour Pilot.

XX. Ship Masters are directed to apply at least four hours before high-water, at the Harbour-Master's Office, for Pilots, previous to sailing.

XXI. The Harbour-Master shall have power to direct the attendance of a sufficient number of Pilots at his office four hours before high-water, so that they may be in readiness to perform the Pilotage duties required.

XXII. The Harbour-Master has power to give directions to Pilots, and to order them to take

charge of any vessel when wanted.

XXIII. On arrival, vessels must be moored or berthed as ordered by the Harbour-Master or his assistants, and Pilots who may be in charge of vessels, must comply with such orders before their Pilotage is considered to be due.

XXIV. All numbers, whether of money or tonnage of vessels, shall be stated by Masters of vessels, and others in words, and not in figures.

Extra Attendance.

For each twenty-four hours' Extra Attendance on board when requested by the Master, the charge to the Master Pilot shall be six shillings, and to each of the boatmen three shillings and sixpence.

For Extra Attendance, not exceeding twelve hours, when requested by Ship Masters (other than Piloting), to the Master Pilot, three shillings, and to each of the boatmen one shilling and sixpence.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of the Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding " of benefices in plurality, and to make better " provision for the residence of the clergy," after reciting that "Whereas in some instances " tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or "districts may be separated from the parishes or "mother churches to which they belong, with " great advantage, and places altogether extraparochial may in some instances with advantage "be annexed to parishes or districts to which "they are contiguous, or be constituted separate "parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when with " respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the "Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop "of any diocese shall represent to the said Arch-" bishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, "place or district within the diocese of such "Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, "as the case may be, may be advantageously "separated from any parish or mother church " and either be constituted a separate benefice by "itself or be united to any other parish to which "it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any "other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, " or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to " form a separate parish or benefice, or that any " extra-parochial place may with advantage be "annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesi-"astical purposes; and the said Archbishop or "Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the " scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the " said Archbishop for his consideration) de-" scribing the mode in which it appears to 46 him that the alteration may best be effected, "and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical juris-"diction, globe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and "other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, " and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, "may be made with justice to all parties in-"terested; and if the patron or patrons of the "benefice or benefices to be affected by such " alteration shall consent in writing under his or "their hands to such scheme, or to such modifi-"cation thereof as the said Archbishop may ap-"prove, and the said Archbishop shall, on full "consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with "any such scheme, or modification thereof, " and shall certify the same and such consent as " aforesaid, by his report to Her Majesty in "Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in "Council to make an Order for carrying such " scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may " be, into effect."

And whereas George Howard Lord Bishop of Truro, hath pursuant to the enactment aforesaid represented in a writing dated the thirtieth day of October one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six to the Right Honourable Edward White, Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows :-

"To the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Edward White by Divine Providence Lord Archbishop of Canterbury.

"We George Howard by Divine permission Bishop of Truro do hereby represent to your Grace as follows ;-

"1. That there is in the county of Cornwall and our diocese of Truro the parish of Talland which has its own parish church and is a vicarage and benefice whereof William Gundry of No. 7 Drapers'-gardens in London Esquire is the patron and the Reverend David Lloyd Thomas is the incumbent.

"2. That the said parish by the census of one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one had a population of seven hundred and eighty persons and the gross annual income of the said vicarage is one hundred and fifty pounds or thereabouts.

"3. That adjoining the said parish of Talland is the parish of Lansallos in the same county and diocese which has its own parish church and is a rectory and benefice whereof Francis Buller Howell of Ethy in the same county Esquire is the patron and the Reverend John Edward Carthew is the incumbent.

"4. That the said parish of Lansallos by the census aforesaid had a population of seven hundred and seventeen persons and the gross annual income of the said rectory is five hundred pounds or thereabouts.

"5. That there is on the sea coast where the said two parishes adjoin a fishing village called Polperro part of which is in the parish of Talland and part in the parish of Lansallos and such village contains a population of one thousand and one hundred persons or thereabouts three hundred and fifty of whom reside in the west or Lansallos

"6. That such village of Polperro is distant from the parish church of Talland about one mile and a half and from the parish church of Lansallos about two miles and a half and there is a chapel in the Lansallos part of the said village licensed for Divine service for the accommodation of the persons residing in such village and for several years past by an arrangement between the incumbents of the said two parishes such chapel has been served by the vicar of Talland.

"7. That it appears to us that under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament of the first and second years of Her present Majesty chapter one hundred and six and the second and third years of Her said Majesty chapter forty-nine that portion of the parish of Lansallos which is described in the schedule hereto and which includes the portion of the village of Polperro lying within that parish may be advantageously separated from the said parish of Lansallos and be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the said parish of Talland to which the same may be more conveniently united.

"8. That pursuant to the twenty-sixth section of the said first-mentioned Act we have prepared the following scheme which together with the consents in writing of the incumbents and patrons of the said parishes of Talland and Lansallos we hereby submit to your Grace to the intent that your Grace may if on full consideration and inquiry you shall be satisfied with such scheme certify the same to Her Majesty in Council.

"Given under our hand this thirtieth day of October one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six. "Georg. H. Truron."

"The SCHEDULE above referred to.

"All that portion of the said parish of Lansallos which is bounded on the east partly by the parish of Talland aforesaid and partly by the English Channel on the south by the English Channel and on the west and north by an imaginary straight line drawn from a point adjoining the sea coast where the close numbered 859 on the tithe apportionment and map of the said parish of Lansallos adjoins the close numbered 860 on the same apportionment and map to a point adjoining the road leading from Looe to Polperro where the hedge separating the close numbered 627 on the said apportionment and map adjoins the close numbered 628 on the same apportionment and map and thence in a straight direction eastward until it reaches the parish of Talland at a point adjoining the said parish where the close numbered 621 on the said apportionment and map of the parish of Lansallos adjoins the close numbered 622 on the same apportionment and map and which said portion of the parish of Lansallos is delineated on the map hereto annexed and is therein coloured pink.

" Georg. H. Truron."

And whereas the scheme and consents referred to in the said representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"That the portion of the parish of Lansallos aforesaid which is described in the schedule to the foregoing representation (and hereinafter called the district of West Polperro) shall henceforth be separated for all ecclesiastical purposes from the remainder of the said parish and be annexed to the said parish of Talland to which the same may be more conveniently united and form together therewith one vicarage and benefice and the Incumbent of the said rectory of Lansallos shall be discharged from all cure of souls within the limits of the district of West Polperro.

"That the rent-charges in lieu of tithes payable in respect of the lands numbered respectively 206 to 209, 613, 615 to 617, 622 to 628, 631 to 643, 822, 829 to 832, 834 to 864, 866 to 870, 872 to 887, 890 to 893, 895, 901 and 902 respectively both inclusive in the tithe apportionment and map of the said parish of Lansallos amounting altogether to the sum of forty pounds four shillings and nine pence and now belonging to the said rectory of Lansallos shall from the time of this scheme taking effect be annexed and belong to the said vicarage of Talland and be held received and enjoyed by the Incumbent thereof and his successors for ever.

"That the fees for marriages churchings burials and all other ecclesiastical offices performed within the limits of the said vicarage of Talland with the district of West Polperro annexed and all ecclesiastical dues offerings and other emoluments arising within the same and usually payable to the incumbent of a benefice (save and except all rent-charges in lieu of tithes and glebe, if any, belonging to the said rectory of Lansallos other than the rent-charges in lieu of tithes so annexed as aforesaid to the said vicarage of Talland) shall belong to the Incumbent of the said vicarage of Talland.

"That except and subject as aforesaid all the endowments and emoluments now belonging to the said rectory of Lansallos shall continue to belong to the same rectory as separated from the district of West Polperro and shall be held received and enjoyed by the incumbent thereof for ever and the ancient parish church within the said parish of Lansællos shall continue to be the parish church thereof.

"That the said vicarage of Talland with the district of West Polperro annexed shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said vicarage was subject to before such annexation and the incumbent of the said vicarage of Talland shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the district of West Polperro.

"That the inhabitants of the said parish of | Talland with the district of West Polperro annexed

shall be exclusively liable for the maintenance of the parish church of Talland and the inhabitants of the district of West Polperro shall be discharged from the maintenance of the parish church of Lansallos and shall not be entitled to any accommodation therein and the inhabitants of the said parish of Lansallos as separated from the district of West Polperro shall be exclusively liable for the maintenance of the said parish church of Lansallos.

"That the patronage of the said vicarage of Talland with the district of West Polperro annexed and of the said rectory of Lansallos as separated from the district of West Polperro shall respectively remain vested in the persons respectively in whom the patronage of the vicarage of Talland and the rectory of Lansallos respectively is now vested.

"That churchwardens for the said parish of Lansallos as separated from the district of West Polperro shall be chosen by the inhabitants of the said parish as so separated and churchwardens for the said parish of Talland shall be chosen as heretofore except that the inhabitants of the district of West Polperro shall be entitled to vote in the election of churchwardens for the same parish.

"We the Reverend John Edward Carthew, rector of the rectory and parish church of Lansallos, the Reverend David Lloyd Thomas vicar of the vicarage and parish church of Talland, Francis Buller Howell of Ethy in the county of Cornwall Esquire patron of the said rectory and parish church of Lansallos and William Gundry of No. 7, Drapers'-gardens, in London, Esquire patron of the said vicarage and parish church of Talland do hereby consent to the foregoing scheme of the Lord Bishop of Truro.

"We the undersigned Edward White Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury do hereby report to Your Majesty in Council.

"That the Right Reverend George Howard Lord Bishop of Truro has represented unto us (amongst other things)

"That there is in the county of Cornwall and diocese of Truro the parish of Talland which has its own parish church and is a vicarage and benefice.

"That adjoining the said parish of Talland is the parish of Llansallos in the same county and diocese which has its own parish church and is a rectory and benefice.

"That there is on the sea coast where the said two parishes adjoin a fishing village called Polperro part of which is in the parish of Talland and part in the parish of Llansallos.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that a portion of the said parish of Llansalles which is described in the schedule to the said Lord Bishop's representation and which includes the portion of the village of Polperro lying within that parish may be advantageously separated from the said parish of Llansallos and be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the said parish of Talland.

"That the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him the proposed alteration may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithe rent-charges dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage may be made with justice to all parties interested which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the patrons and of the incumbents of the said benefices respectively has been transmitted by the said Lord Bishop to us for our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents before referred to are hereunto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the Act of the first and second years of Your Majesty's reign chapter 106 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.

"As witness our hand this twenty fifth day of November one thousand eight hundred and eighty-" Edw. Cantuar.

Now therefore Her Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said scheme be carried into effect.

SCRAPS GATE RIFLE RANGE.

BYE-LAWS under the Artillery and Rifle Ranges Act, 1885, made by Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department, with the consent of the Sheppy Union Rural Sanitary Authority.

1. THE public footpaths on the War Department property crossing the said range or in the rear of the butts there shall, within the limits hereinafter mentioned, be closed to all persons while firing is going on at the said range.

- 2. Any person wishing to pass on any of the said footpaths while firing is going on will apply to the nearest sentry, and desire him to communicate with the officer in command of the firing party, so that either then or when three or more persons requiring to pass shall have collected, firing may cease in order to allow such person or persons to pass.
- 3. No person requiring to pass shall under these bye-laws be required to wait for a longer period than ten minutes.
 - 4. No person passing over any of the said

public footpaths on the War Department property shall on any account diverge therefrom whilst firing is going on.

- 5. The limits between which the said footpaths will be closed as aforesaid are marked Eastward and Westward by posts with copies of these byelaws attached thereto.
- 6. Any person contravening any of these byelaws shall be deemed to commit an offence against the same, and is under the said Act liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding five pounds.
