NAVAL PRIZE MONEY.

*Department of the Accountant-General of the Navy, Admiralty, January 31, 1887.*

NOTICE is hereby given to all persons interested therein, that preparations are now being made for the intended distribution of the slave and tonnage bounties awarded for the slave dhow "Ushar Mismarine,"—two slaves,—and slave dhow "Dunea," captured by Her Majesty's ship "Woodlark," on the 18th and 29th January, and 6th March, 1885, respectively.

Agents or other persons having any just and legal demand, unliquidated, against the award, are required to transmit the particulars of any such demand to the Registrar of the Admiralty Division of Her Majesty's High Court of Justice, in order that the same may be examined, taxed, and allowed by that Officer, and paid under the sanction of the Judge of the said Court.

Due notice will be given, by future advertisement in the London Gazette, of the date proposed for the commencement of distribution; and, at the same time, the amount of an individual's share in the respective classes will be announced.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction consisting of two pieces or parcels of land, comprising together eighteen acres three roods and thirty-five perches, or thereabouts, which have been permanently secured to the vicarage of Eldersfield, in the county of Worcester, and in the diocese of Worcester, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, grant to the Incumbent of the said vicarage of Eldersfield, and to his successors, to meet such benefaction, one yearly sum or stipend of thirty-seven pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the thirtieth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions, on the

first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient, in our opinion, to produce the said yearly sum or stipend, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said vicarage, in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant and appropriate out of our common fund to the united benefice of Gamston-with-Eaton, in the county of Nottingham, and in the diocese of Southwell, one capital sum of three hundred pounds sterling, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of providing a new parsonage or house of residence for the said united benefice, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of two pounds and ten shillings per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said united benefice of Gamston-with-Eaton: Provided always, that the said capital sum of three hundred pounds sterling, expressed to be hereby granted and appropriated to the said united benefice of Gamston-with-Eaton, shall be, and be taken to be, in lieu of, and in substitution for, a portion amounting to ten pounds per annum of the yearly sum or stipend of thirty pounds heretofore payable by us, the said Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said united benefice of Gamston-with-Eaton, under the authority of an instrument sealed by us on the twenty-sixth day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, and published in the London Gazette on the sixth day of March in the same year.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction consisting of a clearly yearly rent-charge of one hundred pounds, which has been permanently secured to the district chapelry and benefice (hereinafter called the benefice) of Micklefield, in the county of York, and in the diocese of York, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, grant to the Incumbent of the said benefice of Micklefield, and to his successors, to meet such benefaction, one yearly sum or stipend of forty-five pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the day of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions, on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient, in our opinion, to produce
