AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 5th day of February, 1887.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—in the Eastern Division of the county of Sussex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing in Ticehurst village at the entrance to the lane there called Pickford-lane past Pickford House down Tinkers-lane into the parish highway leading from Three Legged Cross and along such highway to Overys farm at the bottom of Rosemary-lane, thence by a footpath through Ketly Wood to Quedley farm, thence by the occupation-road to Little Gibbsread farm and along the northern boundary of the main-road there to the said Pickford-lane in Ticehurst village aforesaid,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the twenty-seventh day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the sixth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—in the county of Southampton, comprised within the following boundary, that is to say, commencing at a point at the parish boundary between Froxfield and Privett at Fishers Copse in a north-easterly direction along the said parish boundary to the Basing Dean-road, thence along the said road to the foot of Tallywater Hill, proceeding thence along Kings-lane to its junction

with Green-lane, thence along Green-lane in a south-easterly direction to the hedge dividing the fields numbered 189 and 196 on the Ordnance map, thence in a north-easterly direction along the said hedge and continuing in the same direction by the south-east side of Chawners Plantation till its junction with the main-road leading from the Trooper Inn to Edge Corner, thence along the said main-road to Edge Corner aforesaid, thence along the London and Gosport-road in the direction of Westmeon to The Jumps, thence along Fawley-lane till it joins Hempland-lane, thence along the said lane to Malthouse farm to its junction with the boundary line between the parishes of Froxfield and Privett aforesaid, and thence along the said boundary line to the point at Fishers Copse aforesaid: the said roads (excepting Kings-lane and Green-lane) not being included in the Area,—which was declared by Order of Council to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

(SWINE-FEVER.)

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

SCHEDULE.

An Area comprising all that space on the farm of Granton Mains, in the parish of Cramond, in the county of Edinburgh, being about one hundred and sixty-eight yards in length and about one hundred and fifty yards in breadth, and fenced on the south, east and west sides thereof by a wooden fence, and on the north by a stone wall separating such space from the road (known by the name of the West-road) leading from Granton to Edinburgh, all such space being about thirty-eight yards from Granton Public-School on the east, about one hundred and sixty yards from Sunnyside Cottages on the west, and there being between such space and Sunnyside a ploughed field which extends behind such space on the south.
