THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Rome, enclosing a translation of a Decree published by the Minister of the Interior, stating that ships employed in carrying passengers between the various ports of the Kingdom shall, from the 29th ultimo, be exempted from the obligation of providing themselves with a doctor; and that the facilities provided by Articles 93, 94, and 105 of the Ministerial Instructions of 26th December, 1871, for admitting ships to pratique shall be re-established.
