A PROCLAMATION.

WILLIAM R.

Whereas Their Majesties have received Information upon Oath, That the Persons herein after particularly named, have结合 together, and, with diverse other Persons, the Papists, to raise Rebellion, and for that purpose have made Provision of Arms, and have Listed themselves in several Regiments, Troops and Companies, under pretence of Commissions from the late King James; Their Majesties have thought fit, by the Advice of Their Privy Council, to Issue out this Royal Proclamation, and to hereby strictly Charge and Command Thomas Tidteley of the Lodge in Mairs Cough in the County of Lancaster, John Gidlington of Theloland Castle in the same County, Esq; Thomas Tidteley of the Lodge in Mairs Cough aforesaid, Gent; Richard Butler of the same place, Gent; Henry Butler of the same place, Richard Butler another of the Sons of the said Richard Butler, Alexander Butler of Tandentcliffe in the said County, Thomas Carus Son of Christopher Carus of Wetherill in the said County, Esq; William Westby Son of Francis Westby of Wetherill Cough aforesaid, Gent. Goodman late of Oakliff in the said County, George Carus of Sellell-hall in the said County, Gent. Thomas Butler Gent, another Son of the said Richard Butler, Esq; Knappe eldest son of William Knape of Hallinghall in the County of York, Gent. Cole late of Theloland Castle, Gent. William Milneaux Esq; Son of Caryll Lord Viscount Milneaux of the Kingdom of Ireland, William Gerrard, Son of Sir William Gerrard of Carrwood in the said County of Lancaster Baronet, Thomas Westby of Mostbeck in the said County of Lancaster, Esq; Robert Milneaux of Scarborough in the said County of Lancaster, William Maficy of Puddington in the County of Cheshire, Esq; Christopher Carus of Halton in the said County of Lancaster, Esq; Richard Stanley Son of Thomas Stanley of Eccleton in the said County of Lancaster, Esq; George Carus Son of the said Christopher Carus of Halton, Charles Townely Son of Richard Townely of Townely in the said County of Lancaster, Esq; William Standish of Standish in the said County of Lancaster, Esq; Richard Westfall of Highton in the said County of Lancaster, Gent. Thomas Brackett late of Standish aforesaid, Gent. Robert Dalton of Thurlestone in the said County of Lancaster, Esq; Edmund Threlfall of the Ashes in the said County of Lancaster, Gent. Thomas Worthington junior, of Wiggan in the said County of Lancaster, Cheshire, Gent. Goodwin a Romish Priest, and also the several Persons lately called by the Name before mentioned, viz Captain Harrington, Captain Penny, Lieutenant Penalt, Colonel Tempeit, Captain Eyre alias Barlow, David Thornton of Oldsteds in the County of York, and Colton of Oldsteds aforesaid, and every of them, forthwith to Restraine themselves to some one of Their Majesties offices of the Peace, and in case they do not Return thitherwards, Their Majesties do hereby Require and Command at their Lodging there, or to Disover, Take, and apprehend them wherever they may be found, and to carry them before the next Justice of the Peace or Chief Magistrate, who are hereby required to Commit them to the next Gaol, there to remain until they be thence delivered by due course of Law. And Their Majesties do hereby Require the said Justice, or other Magistrate, immediately to give Notice thereof to Their Council. And Their Majesties do hereby give Notice to all Persons that shall Conceal the Persons above-named, or any of them, or be Aiding & Assisting in the Concealing of them, or furthering their Escape, That they shall be proceeded against for such their Offence with the utmost Severity according to Law.

A PROCLAMATION.

Commanding all Papists, and Reputed Papists, forthwith to depart from the Cities of London and Westminster, and from within Ten Miles of the same.

Vwhereas notwithstanding the several Acts of Parliament, whereby the Relenting of Papists to the Cities of London and Westminster, and Places therunto adjacent, are declared to be dangerous to the Peace and Safety of this Kingdom, and the Ways and Methods Provided and Enacted, as well for Discovering as punishing them; And notwithstanding the Ma-

nifestation of Their Majesties Popish Subjects to exceed Their Protection and Royal Grace so abundantly, or Their Subjects that will leave Quarterly and Periodically under Their Government, divers Popish Recusants, being accustomed to their Habitues dissevering, and of religion apart, as well as others, Refusing to obey just Laws and Places in great numbers, and thereby having opportunity to meet, have taken great delight in Confit and Profess their divers Mischievous and Troublesome Devices and Practices, contrary to the Duty of their Allegiance. Their Majesties have therefore thought fit (by the Advice of Their Privy Council) to Issue out this Royal Proclamation, and do hereby strictly Charge and Command all Popish Recusants, and Persons reputed to be, (except Merchants Strangers, and such other Persons as in the said Acts are Excepted) on or before the Second and twentieth Day of this instant June, to depart out of the said Cities, and from all Places without the space of Ten Miles of the same. And Their Majesties do hereby further Require and Command, That if any of the said Popish Recusants, or Reputed, shall presume to remain within either of the said Cities, or Ten Miles adjacent, or repute or return to the same, they be proceeded against as Persons Conspiracy against the Peace and Welfare of the Government. And Their Majesties do hereby further Require and Command, That if any of the said Popish Recusants, or Reputed, shall presume to remain within either of the said Cities, or Ten Miles adjacent within the said Cities, and either of them, and Envoy for, and with all Vigour Proceed against all and every Person or Persons who shall be found within the said Cities of London and Westminster, and within Ten Miles of the same, courrying to the Effect of any of the said Statutes, and the Purpose of this Their Majesties Proclamation. And Their Majesties do further Strictly Charge and Command, That soon directly after the said Second and twentieth Day of June, the Gaolers, Clerks, Warders, and other Officers within the said Cities and Places, do go from House to House in their several Parishes, Hamlets, Constableties and Divisions respectively, and there take an Account of the Names, and Siamesies of such Persons as are Popish Recusants, or reputed to be, as well Workmen as Labourers or Servants, and to carry a List of their Names to the two next Justices of the Peace, who are hereby Required and Enjoined to send for, and Proceed against them (Excepting always Merchants Foreigners, Settled Householders, and other Persons in the said Act Excepted) as before said; and that the said Justices are likewise Required, when they shall have received such List or Lists, to certify the same, together with their Proceedings therupon, to Their Majesties most Honourable Privy Council.

A PROCLAMATION.

For the Confinement of Popish Recusants within Five Miles of their respective Dwellings.

THeir Majesties having received Information, That divers Popish Recusants bearing Correspondence with, or Envoying Their Majesties Enemies, do withdraw from their Habitation, Dislocating and Endeavouring to corrupt and Seduce Their Majesties Subjects, and thereby Erecting to Sedition and Rebellion, at this time, whilst Their Majesties, with most of the Power of Christendom, are Engaged in a necessary War against the French King, for Their common Security, and the particular Preservation of these Kingdoms, wherein the Interest and Safety of all and Regular Their Majesties Subjects do depend. Have thought fit (by the Advice of Their Privy Council) to Issue this Their Royal Proclamation, and do hereby strictly Charge and Command all Popish Recusants, being above the Age of Sixteen Years, born within any of Their Majesties Realms or Dominions, or made Denizens. That they and each of them do (according to the Statutes in that behalf made) repair to their respective Places of Abode, and if they have no Places of abode, then to the Places where the Father or Mother of such respective Papists, or that be their dwelling, and do not therefore Remove or Pass above Five Miles from thence. And Their Majesties do hereby further Strictly Charge and Command all Their Judges, Justices, Magistrates, Admirals and Officers, That if such Popish Recusant, or Person reputed to be, shall not repair to his or her Place of Abode, and those continue with it Removing or Passing more Five Miles from thence, according to the said Statute and Rule of the Statute.
