REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, before twelve o'clock, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations

shall be made at Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at half-past one o'clock.

THEREAS by the Medical Act, 1886, it is provided (amongst other things) that We may from time to time by Order in Council declare that the second part of the said Act shall be deemed, on and after a day to be named in such Order, to apply to any British possession which in Our opinion affords to the medical practitioners of the United Kingdom such privileges of practising in the said British possession as to Us may seem just, and from and after the day named in such Order in Council, such British possession shall be deemed to be a British possession to which the said Act applies, within the meaning of the second part thereof, and that until such Order in Council has been made in respect of any British possession the said second part of the said Act shall not be deemed to apply to any such

And whereas New Zealand is a British possession within the meaning of the said Act, and affords, in Our opinion, to the registered medical practitioners of the United Kingdom such privileges of practising in New Zealand as to Us seems just under and by virtue of the provisions of an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and intituled the "Medical Practitioners Registration Act, 1869."

"Medical Practitioners Registration Act, 1869."
Now, therefore, We do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, order, direct, and declare that, on and after the first day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, the second part of the Medical Act, 1886, shall be deemed to apply to New Zealand.

And whereas the light from the lighthouse on Copeland Island off the coast of the County

Down has been extinguished:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Act, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct that from and after the date of this Order, or from and after the time of the receipt of a copy of this Order by the officers authorized to collect light dues, the tolls of threesixteenths of a penny per ton oversea, and onesixteenth of a penny per ton coasting now leviable in respect of the light on Copeland Island shall cease; and that in lieu thereof there shall be leviable in respect of the said light and fogsignal on Mew Island for every ship, whether British or foreign, the toll of three-eighths of a penny per ton of the burden of every such ship for each time of passing or deriving benefit therefrom if on an oversea voyage, and one-eighth of a penny per ton if on a coasting voyage:

The said tolls shall be levied, subject to the regulations and exemptions contained in the Consolidated Table of Light Duties sanctioned by Orders in Council, dated, respectively, the twentyfourth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, and the sixteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, and in the Order in Council dated the twenty-first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and also in the special section of the Consolidated Tables prepared in pursuance of an Order in Council dated the sixth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, or to such other regulations and exemptions as may from time to time be duly sanctioned; and subject also to the gross abatement or discount of seventy per centum mentioned in an Order in Council dated the fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, or to such other abatement or discount as may for the time being C. Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct that, from and after the exhibition of the said improved light, or from and after the time of the receipt of notice of such exhibition by the officers authorized to collect light dues, there shall in lieu of the tolls hitherto levied in respect of the existing light be paid in respect of the said improved light and fog signal for every ship, whether British or foreign, the toll of threeeighths of a penny per ton of the burden of every such ship for each time of passing or deriving benefit therefrom if on an oversea voyage, and one-eighth of a penny per ton if on a coasting voyage.

The said tolls shall be levied subject to the regulations and exemptions contained in the Consolidated Table of Light Duties sanctioned by Orders in Council dated respectively the twenty-fourth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, and the sixteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, and in the Order in Council dated the twenty first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and also in the special section of the Consolidated Tables prepared in pursuances of an Order in Council dated the sixth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, or to such other regulations and exemptions as may from time to time be duly sanctioned, and subject also to the gross abatement or discount of seventy per centum mentioned in an Order in Council dated the fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, or to such other abatement or discount as may for the time being be in force. "We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth. of thel and third years of Your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nine-teenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of the Holy Saviour situate at Sugley in the parish of Newburn in the county of Northumberland and in the diocese of Newcastle.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of the Holy Saviour situate at Sugley as aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Ernest Roland, Bishop of the said diocese of Newcastle (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Newburn which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of the Holy Saviour situate at Sugley as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of the

Holy Saviour, Sugley.'

"And with the like consent of the said Ernest Roland, Bishop of the said diocese of Newcastle (testified as aforesaid) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of the Holy Saviour situate at Sugley as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always that so long as the Reverend Samuel Bucknell, Clerk in Holy Orders the present vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the said parish of Newburn shall continue to be such vicar or incumbent, all the fees which may be received in respect of such publication solemnization or performance at the said church of the Holy Saviour situate at Sugley as aforesaid shall be paid over by the minister thereof to the said Samuel Bucknell: And provided also that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism, or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty in your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of the Holy Saviour,

Sugley, being :-

"All that part of the parish of Newburn in the county of Northumberland and in the diocese of Newcastle which is bounded upon the south by the county of Durham and diocese of Durham, or in other words by the River Tyne, and upon the south-east partly by the new parish of Saint James Benwell situate partly in the said county of Northumberland and partly in the county of the town of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, and wholly in the diocese of Newcastle aforesaid, and partly by

the new parish of Saint Nicholas Gosforth in the said county of Northumberland and in the diocese of Newcastle aforesaid, and upon all other sides, that is to say, upon the north-east, and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point a little to the south-east of Black House. where the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Nicholas Gosforth from the parish of Newburn aforesaid crosses the middle of the Stamfordham-road, the said point being at a distance of six chains or thereabouts to the northwest of the houses called or known as Slatyford, and extending thence, that is, from the said point, north-westward along the middle of the said road for a distance of one mile and a quarter or thereabouts to its intersection by Hill Head-lane, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of one mile and three chains or thereabouts to its junction with the Carlisle and Newcastle high-road and with Hope-lane, and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of a quarter of a mile or thereabouts to its junction at Union Hall with Newburn-lane and extending thence westward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of thirty-five chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the Coronation and Blucher Pit Branch of the Wallbottle Wagonway, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said wagonway for a distance of forty-three and a half chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the Newburn and Lemington-road and extending thence south-westward and in a straight line for a distance of twenty-seven chains or thereabouts to the nearest point on the county and diocesan boundary in the middle of the said River Tyne which boundary is also the southern boundary of the parish of Newburn as aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diecese of Newcastle.

(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 30th day of March, 1887.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—in the Eastern Division of the county of Sussex, comprised within the following boundary, that is to say, from the junction of the Old London-road and the Hastings and Rye-road at the Police Station, Ore, up the east side of Old London-road to Coghurst Lodge, from thence by the Coghurst coach-road to the public footpath crossing such road, from thence by such footpath to the iron bridge over the South-Eastern Railway on to Pigeon Cove Cottage, thence by the footpath to Bachelors' Bump, from thence by the footpath towards North's Seat to the footpath leading to Ore, from thence by such last-mentioned footpath to the gateway leading into Middle-road, Ore, from thence in a straight line past the Black Mill, Ore, to the Hastings and Rye-road nearly opposite Ore Parish Cemetery, and from thence by the last-mentioned road to the Ore Police Station aforesaid, -which was declared by Order of Council dated the twentieth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eightyseven, to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuropneumonia, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

All that space in the parish of Saint Nicholas, in the Burgh of Aberdeen, situate at Pocra Jetty on the north side of the tidal harbour of Aberdeen, and including the whole of the said jetty, and comprehended within the following boundaries namely,—commencing at a point on the roadway of Pocra Quay thirty-six feet north-east of the extreme west end of Pocra Quay wall, thence in a south-westerly direction for a distance of seventy-two feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wooden fence, thence in a south-westerly direction for a distance of eighty-six feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wooden fence, thence in a north-westerly direction for a distance of one hundred and fifty-four feet or thereabouts along the edge of the wharf of the said jetty, thence in a north-easterly direction for a distance of thirtyone feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wooden fence, thence in an easterly direction for a distance of one hundred and fifty-four feet or thereabouts, and bounded by a wooden fence, thence in a south-easterly direction for a distance of one hundred and three feet or thereabouts and bounded by a wooden fence and six gates to the point on the roadway of Pocra Quay before mentioned; all which space is coloured pink on the plan of the said Landing-Place deposited for the purposes of this Order at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the burgh of Aberdeen.

THE following is a translation of a Note which has been received from the French Minister of Foreign Affairs by Her Majesty's Ambassador at Paris respecting the manner in which persons, having claims for losses sustained by them during the war between France and Madagascar, will be allowed to support them before the Indemnity Commission :-

" M. L'Ambassadeur,

"IN your Note of the 1st instant your Excellency was good enough to express a desire for information as to the manner in which British subjects who have suffered losses in Madagascar will be allowed to support their claims before the Commission charged with the distribution of the indemnity.

"I hasten to inform you of the Regulations which the Commission, acting under the authority conferred upon it, has thought fit to draw up for

its own guidance in this matter.

"It has decided that persons interested may furnish the Commissioner whose duty it is to report upon their claims with explanations, oral or written, and with such evidence as they may judge proper. The Commission is even prepared to allow them, if a special request to that effect is made, to be heard either in person or by deputy, but only to offer explanations or answer questions. It holds, on the contrary, that no arguments nor pleadings can be allowed before it."
