Naples, June 6. E have an account by Letters of the 29th patt from Melfina, of the arrival there of the Pope's Galleys with those of Mata, in their way towards the Levant. Our Viceroy has taken up a confi tecable Sum of Money at Interest, to be remitted to the Governor of Milan; and there will be likewife fent from hence 2000 Men for the Service of that State.
