PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, before twelve o'clock, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and with reference especially to Article 96 of The Animals Order of 1886, do hereby license the Local Authority for the county of Middlesex, to dig up or cause to be dug up, within fourteen days after the date of this Licence, the carcases of two pigs reported to have been recently buried at Wembly Hill, in the county of Middlesex, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. When dug up the Local Authority shall forthwith cause a post-mortem examination to be made of the carcases with a view to ascertain the cause of death of such animals, and the Local Authority shall then cause the carcases to be re-buried as soon as possible, and shall cause them to be covered with a sufficient quantity of quick lime or other disinfectant, and with not less than six feet of earth.
- The expenses of and incidental to the digging up, post-mortem examination, and re-burial of the carcases shall be defrayed by the Local Authority.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board. Altering General Order as to Outdoor Relief to able-bodied Male Persons:—

Whitechapel Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Whitechapel Union, in the county of Middlesex;— And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by a General Order, dated the 14th day of December, 1852, addressed, amongst others, to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Whitechapel Union, the Poor Law Board prescribed certain Regulations with regard to the administration of out-door relief to poor persons in the said Union;

And whereas by Article 6 of the said Order it is directed that "every able-bodied male person, "if relieved out of the Workhouse, shall be set to work by the Guardians, and be kept employed "under their direction and superintendence so "long as he continues to receive relief";

And whereas it is expedient that certain further provisions should be made temporarily with regard to the administration of out-door relief in the said Union:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the said Whitechapel Union may, after not less than seven days' notice of the proposal has been sent by their Clerk to each Guardian, pass a Resolution to the effect that the powers conferred by this Order shall be exercised by them, and a copy of such Resolution shall be forwarded to Us by the Clerk within one week of the same having been passed.

ARTICLE II.—From and after the passing of such Resolution, and during a period not exceeding twelve calendar months from the date hereof, it shall be lawful, in the case of any able-bedied male person relieved in the Workhouse who shall not in any one week ending on Saturday be absent from the Workhouse more than once, nor for a period exceeding twenty-four hours, nor without the consent of the Guardians, for the Guardians to relieve out of the Workhouse the wife and family of such able-bodied person, and also such person whilst he is so absent from the Workhouse as aforesaid, without setting such person to work during the time, or any part thereof, that he is so absent, anything in the above-cited General Order to the contrary notwithstanding.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board. Altering General Order as to Tenure of Office of District Medical Officers:—

Parish of Birmingham.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Birmingham, in the County of Warwick;— And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by an Order dated the 16th day of January, 1850, the Poor Law Board prescribed Rules and Regulations relating to the government and guidance of the Guardians of the Poor of the said Parish of Birmingham, and made provision for the appointment by the said Guardians from time to time of persons to hold certain offices, including the office of District Medical Officer;

And whereas by a General Order dated the 10th day of August, 1870, addressed, amongst others, to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Parish, the Poor Law Board altered certain provisions of the above-cited Order with regard to the tenure of office of District Medical Officers to be appointed in the said Parish after the 29th day of September then next following, and ordered, amongst other things, as follows; namely,—

"ARTICLE 2.—Every District Medical Officer duly qualified as aforesaid at the time of his appointment, and then being, or within two months after his appointment becoming, resident within the District for which he shall be appointed to act, shall hold his office until he shall die, or resign, or be proved to be insane in the same manner as in the previous Article, or become legally disqualified to hold such office, or be removed by the said Board, or cease to reside within such District."

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, so far as regards the said parish of Birmingham, and with regard to appointments to the office of District Medical Officer to be made by the Guardians of the Poor of the said Parish after the fifth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, hereby rescind Article 2 of the above-cited General Order, and in place thereof Order as follows; that is to say,—

ARTICLE 2.—Every District Medical Officer duly qualified at the time of his appointment

according to the regulations of the Poor Law Board or the Local Government Board in force at the time, and then being, or within two months after his appointment becoming, resident within the District for which he shall be appointed to act, shall continue to hold office until he die, or resign, or be dismissed by the Guardians, subject to the consent of the Local Government Board, or be removed by the Local Government Board, or be proved to be insane by evidence which that Board shall deem sufficient, or become legally disqualified to hold such office, or cease to reside within the District for which he shall be appointed to act as aforesaid.

Provided that the Guardians may, with the like consent, determine the appointment of any such officer at any time before, or at, the expiration of the first year of his service, by giving to the officer three months' previous notice in writing, signed by their Clerk, of such their intention.

BALTIC ENTRANCES.

GREAT BELT-NORTHERN ENTRANCE. (1.) Seierö Deep-Light-Buoy South-Eastward of Hatter Barn Shoal.

THE Danish Government has given notice, that on about 1st May, 1887, the beacon with red staff and broom marking the south-east entrance of Hatter Barn Shoal, west side of Seiero Deep, northern entrance to Great Belt, will be replaced by a buoy lighted by gas:-

The light will be an occulting white light, visible for periods of five seconds' duration, followed by eclipses of two and a half seconds, eight times every minute. It will be elevated 12 feet above the sea, and should be seen in clear weather

from a distance of 6 miles.

The light-buoy, conical in shape, with super-structure, will be painted red, with Hatter Barn in white letters; it will be moored in a depth of 6 fathoms.

Position, lat. 55° $52\frac{1}{2}$ ′ N., long. 10° $52\frac{1}{4}$ ′ E. Note.—Should it be necessary on account of ice, this light-buoy will be withdrawn, and the beacon with red staff and broom replaced.

(2.) Reef Ness-Light-Buoy Westward of Puller Rocks.

Also, has given notice, that on about 1st May, 1887, the white beacon buoy with staff and red ball, marking the western edge of Puller Rocks, Reef Ness, northern entrance to Great Belt, will be replaced by a buoy lighted by gas:

The light will be an occulting white light, visible for periods of five seconds' duration, followed by eclipses of ten seconds. It will be elevated 12 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear

weather from a distance of 6 miles.

The light-buoy, conical in shape, with superstructure, will be painted white, with Revsnaes in red letters; it will be moored in a depth of 6 fathoms.

Position, lat. 55° 45¼' N., long. 10° 50¾' E.

Note.-Should it be necessary on account of ice, this light-buoy will be withdrawn, and the white beacon buoy with staff and red ball replaced. THE SOUND.

(3.) Drogden Channel-Intended Alteration in Light-Vessel and in Character of Light, and Fog Signal.

Also, has given notice, that at the end of April,

1887, the light-vessel Dragör, or Drogden, southwestward of Quartus Ground, Drogden Channel, south entrance to the Sound, will be replaced by a vessel with main and jigger masts, and that the following alterations will be made in the character

of the light and fog signal:-

The light, shown from the mainmast, will be a double flashing white light, every thirty seconds, giving a flash of two and a half seconds' duration, an eclipse of five seconds, a flash of two and a half seconds, followed by an eclipse of twenty seconds. It will be elevated 30 feet above the sea and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 10 miles.

NORWEGIAN COASTS.

System of Beacons and Buoyage.

THE Norwegian Government has given notices that the following system of beacons and buoyage is and will be adopted, in marking the channels and shoals on and near the coasts of Norway:

A .- Fixed beacons near the fairway will be provided with an arm indicating on which side the fairway lies. When vessels may pass on either side, the beacons will have two arms, one on each side.

Beacons marking shoals in open Norwegian waters will be without arms.

B.—Floating beacons and buoys from the Swedish boundary to Lister (about 17 miles north-westward of the Naze) will be surmounted by topmarks in accordance with the following system:-

1. A white perch with broom turned upwards, signifies that the shoal is situated northward or eastward of the mark.

2. A black perch with broom turned downwards, signifies that the shoal is situated southward or westward of the mark.

Note.—In fairways, the direction of which is northerly and southerly, vessels should pass westward of the white perches, and eastward of the black perches; and in fairways, trending easterly and westerly, vessels should keep to southward of the white perches, and northward of the black perches.

Perches painted white and black in horizontal stripes, and with ball, signify that in the direction of the fairway they may be passed on

Buoys are painted red as heretofore, with staff of colour and character similar to the perches above described.

Note.—During the winter season the floating buoys and beacons in the inner channels are removed, and those in the fairways between the Swedish boundary and Lister, in which there is danger of ice, have their topmarks (brooms and balls) removed in the month of December, and replaced in the following spring, after the disappearance of ice.
