PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, before twelve o'clock, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

WHEREAS by Section 311 of the Public Health Act, 1875, it is enacted as follows:—

"Any Local Board constituted either before
"or after the passing of this Act may, with
"the sanction of the Local Government
"Board, change their name. Every such
"change of name shall be published in such
"manner as the Local Government Board
"may direct";

And whereas at a Meeting held, after due notice, on the 14th day of December, 1886, the said Upper Sedgley Local Board resolved that the name of the said Board should be altered from Upper Sedgley Local Board to Sedgley Local Board; and application has been made by them to Us, the Local Government Board, to sanction such change of name:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby give Our sanction to the name of the said Local Board being changed to the "Sedgley Local Board."
