TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING ROOMS.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, before twelve c'clock, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Rooms, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: (Altering General Consolidated Order); Prohibiting Admission of Smull-Pox Cases to the Workhouse:-

Chertsey Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Chertsey Union, in the county of Surrey ;-

To the Churchwardeus and Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised in the said Union ;-

To the Relieving Officers of the said Union, and the Master and Matron of the Workhouse thereof;-

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Guardians of the Poor of the said Chertsey Union are in possession of a Workhouse which includes Casual Wards and a detached wooden Building known as the Small-Pox Hospital;

And whereas it is expedient that persons suffering from Small-Pox should not be admitted

into the said Workhouse:

Now, therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:-

ARTICLE I .- From and after the date hereof We hereby prohibit the said Guardians from granting any Order for the admission into the said Workhouse of any person suffering from Small-Pox, and We prohibit the Relieving Officers of the said Union, and every Overseer of every Parish therein, from granting any such Order; and the Master, Matron, or other Officer of the said Workhouse from admitting into the said Workhouse any person suffering as aforesaid.
