

of the trade carried on therein, require the grant of this special exception, and that such exception can be granted without injury to the health of the young persons and women affected thereby :

Now I, the Right Honourable Henry Matthews, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by this Order, made under Part 2 of the said Act, extend this exception accordingly : Provided that it shall be a condition of the employment of any young person or woman under this extended exception that there shall be a cubic space of at least four hundred feet for every young person and woman employed after 8 P.M., and provided further that neither young persons or women, or any of them, be employed under any circumstances after 9 P.M.

This Order shall come into effect on the 4th proximo, and shall continue in force until revoked.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners order, direct, and declare as follows :—

1. The Warrant of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, dated the 21st day of October, 1886, shall be repealed, revoked, and annulled, on and as from the day on which this Warrant comes into operation.

Definition.

2. In this Warrant the expression "Parcel" means a Postal Packet which is posted as a Parcel, in accordance with the provisions of this Warrant, or any Warrant amending the same.

Places between which Parcels may be Transmitted.

3. From and after the date when this Warrant comes into operation, Parcels may, subject to the provisions of this Warrant, be transmitted by Post—

(1.) By way of the United Kingdom and the several routes specified in the First Schedule hereto, between the places mentioned in the first column of such schedule and the countries mentioned in the second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, eighth, and ninth columns respectively of such Schedule, and

(2.) Between the places mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto by the routes respectively therein mentioned.

Rates of Postage.

4. On all Parcels transmitted by Post under this Warrant between the respective places mentioned in the Schedules hereto, there shall be charged and paid according to the route of transmission and weight of such Parcels respectively, the several rates of Postage specified in such Schedules.

Maximum Dimensions.

5. There shall not be conveyed or tendered for conveyance by Post under this Warrant any Parcel exceeding the following dimensions, that is to say :—

(1.) Any Parcel posted in or addressed to any of the places mentioned in the second, third,

fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, eighth, and ninth columns of the First Schedule hereto which shall exceed in any direction two feet.

(2.) Any Parcel for transmission between any of the places mentioned in the first part of the Second Schedule which shall exceed in length three feet six inches, or in length and girth measured together six feet, such girth being measured round the thickest part of such Parcel.

(3.) Any Parcel for transmission between the places mentioned in the second part of the Second Schedule hereto which shall exceed in length two feet or in width or depth one foot.

Maximum Weight.

6. There shall not be conveyed or tendered for conveyance by Post under this Warrant any Parcel exceeding in weight as follows, that is to say :—

(1.) Any Parcel posted in any place mentioned in the first part of the First Schedule hereto addressed to Austria-Hungary, Denmark, Heligoland, Switzerland, Germany, Italy, or Sweden, or posted in any of the last-named countries addressed to any place mentioned in the first part of the said First Schedule which shall exceed Six pounds in weight.

(2.) Any Parcel posted in any place mentioned in the first part of the said First Schedule, or Cape Town, or any place mentioned in the first part of the Second Schedule hereto respectively addressed to Belgium, the Netherlands, Luxemburg, or Norway, or posted in any of the last-named countries, addressed to any place mentioned in the first part of the said First Schedule, or Cape Town, or any place mentioned in the first part of the said Second Schedule respectively which shall exceed Eleven pounds in weight.

(3.) Any Parcel posted in any place in the Cape of Good Hope (including Cape Town), addressed to Austria-Hungary, Denmark, Heligoland, Switzerland, Germany, Italy, or Sweden, or posted in any of such last-mentioned countries, addressed to any place in the Cape of Good Hope (including Cape Town), which shall exceed Seven pounds in weight.

(4.) Any Parcel posted in or addressed to either of the places mentioned in the second part of the said Second Schedule which shall exceed three pounds in weight.

Mode of Posting.

7. Subject to the provisions of this Warrant, all parcels shall be posted, forwarded, conveyed, and delivered, under and subject to the provisions of the Warrants respectively relating to the Parcel Post, between the United Kingdom and the country or place in which the parcel is posted, and to the Parcel Post between the United Kingdom and the country or place to which the Parcel shall be addressed, so far as such provisions are applicable.

8. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.
