TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. Clause 20 of the Warrant of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, dated the twenty-eighth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, shall be repealed, so far as it affects Parcels containing any letter or communication of the nature of a letter transmitted between the United Kingdom and Trinidad.

2. There shall not be conveyed or tendered for conveyance by post between the United Kingdom and Trinidad, any Parcel containing or bearing any letter or communication in the nature of a letter, and any such Parcel if posted or tendered for conveyance by post may be detained, and either returned or given up to the sender thereof, or dealt with or disposed of in such other manner as may be authorized by the Postmaster-General.

3. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

WHEREAS the Poor Law Commissioners, by a General Order bearing date the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, made certain rules and regulations relating to the administration of relief to the Poor within certain Unions, including the said Walsall Union; and by Articles 177, 178, 179, 180, 181, 182, and 183 of the said Order provision was made for the payment of special fees to Medical Officers in certain cases;
