(SWINE-FEVER.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 4th day of June, 1887.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Place (namely),—the whole of the premises in the occupation of Mr. B. Biffa, at Wembly Hill, Harrow, in the county of Middlesex,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the twenty-eighth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, to be a Place infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Place shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fifth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.
